Five-Point Road Map of the State Administration Council

- 1. The Union Election Commission will be reconstituted and its mandated tasks, including the scrutiny of voter lists, shall be implemented in accordance with the law.
- 2. Effective measures will be taken with added momentum to prevent and manage the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 3. Actions will be taken to ensure the speedy recovery of businesses from the impact of COVID-19.
- 4. Emphasis will be placed on achieving enduring peace for the entire nation in line with the agreements set out in the Nationwide Ceasefire Agreement.
- 5. Upon accomplishing the provisions of the state of emergency, free and fair multiparty democratic elections will be held in line with the 2008 Constitution, and further work will be undertaken to hand over State duties to the winning party in accordance with democratic standards.

Public Notice

- 1. Since it is important to get the full revenue from exports, the main source of foreign exchange into the country, Section 38-b of the Foreign Exchange Management Law and Paragraph 35 of the Foreign Exchange Management Rule stipulate that the exporter is required to have export earnings in foreign currency into his/her bank account within six months from the date of shipment (within three months from 10-11-2021).
- 2. Therefore, in order to ensure that export earnings of the exporters who exported between 2016, 2017, and 2018, are credited back to their bank accounts in foreign currency within six months from the date of shipping, the Central Committee on Ensuring the Smooth flow of Trade and Goods, the Ministry of Investment
- and Foreign Economic Relations, the Ministry of Legal Affairs, the Ministry of Commerce, the Central Bank of Myanmar, the Republic of 3. the Union of Myanmar Federation of Chambers of Commerce and Industry (UMFCCI), and the Foreign Exchange Authorized Dealer (AD) Licenced Banks, have already done the following: —
- (a) Clarification by AD Banks (within three years)
- (b) Clarification by the UMFCCI (60 days)
- (c) Announcing to clarify in the newspapers and the website of the Central Bank of Myanmar (60 days)
- (d) The Ministry of Commerce closes the registration certificate of importers and exporters (Pa-Tha-Ka) for

- those who do not clarify (30 days)
 (e) Five meetings with exporters led
 by the Central Committee
- s. Exporters are required to comply with Section 38-b of the Foreign Exchange Management Law, which states, "No one shall fail to deposit all export earnings into his bank account in the country in foreign currency within the stipulated period," and "Violation of this prohibition is punishable by imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year or a fine or both punishments must be imposed under Section 42-a of the law."
- Sending notification, revocation of the business registration licence, and holding meetings were done to discuss several times under Paragraph (2) above, but there are 177 companies that exported within 2016,
- 2017, and 2018 and they remain to enter the revenue. An announcement was made on 10-5-2022 that action is being taken against 158 companies of 177 companies under Section 42-a of the Foreign Exchange Management Law and the boards of directors listed together with the companies have been blacklisted.
- The remaining 19 companies (list attached) are under prosecution under Section 42-a of the Foreign Exchange Management Law, and the boards of directors of the attached companies have been blacklisted. Other companies are also under investigation for taking action on remaining export earnings.

MoPF Union Minister attends 25th ASEAN+3 finance ministers and central bank governors' meeting

UNION Minister for Planning and Finance U Win Shein attended the 25th ASEAN+3 Finance Ministers and Central Bank Governors meeting jointly chaired by the People's Republic of China and Cambodia via a virtual system yesterday.

The meeting discussed global and regional macroeconomic perspectives and priorities on inclusive recovery plans in the aftermath of the COVID-19 pandemic, the progress of the ASEAN + 3 Macroeconomic Research Office (AMRO), the status of the ongoing implementation of the Chiang Mai Initiative Multilateralization (CMIM) Action Plan, technical assistance programmes for the development of the Asian bond market and future plans.



At the meeting, the Union Minister said Myanmar support the implementation of AMRO as a Regional Knowledge Hub and the implementation of the medium-term plan (2022-2026). He urged AMRO

to work on the development of financial digitalization and digital transformation methods that have been developed in conjunction with the COV-ID-19 outbreak. Myanmar is working with other member

countries for technical assistance for the development of the Asian bond market. In addition, it is also involved in the capacity building activities of the financial resilience against climate and natural disasters working group and is working to revive its economy after the COVID-19 pandemic. They also discussed closer cooperation with ASEAN + 3 countries in the regional economic recovery process.

The ASEAN + 3 Finance Ministers and Central Bank Governors' Meeting is held annually by China, Japan and the Republic of Korea in rotation. This year's ASEAN + 3 meetings are being held in the form of virtual meetings. The meeting was attended by ASEAN + 3 Finance Ministers and Central Bank Governors, Heads of the International Monetary Fund, Asian Development Bank, and ASEAN + 3 Macroeconomic Research Office and ASEAN Secretariat. — MNA

Information released on legal migration, risk of illegal migration to Thailand

THE Memorandum of Understanding on Myanmar-Thailand Labour Cooperation was signed on 21 June 2003 and the employment agreement was signed on 24 June 2016.

The MoU system was used to send 915,980 legal workers to Thailand as of 18 March 2020.

The Ministry of Labour resumed the process of officially sending workers to Thailand after negotiations between the two countries.

A total of 287 workers on 10 May and 301 workers on 11 May were officially sent through Myawady-Mae Sot to work in their respective workplaces, and the MoU system will continue to send legal workers on a regular basis.

Myanmar workers working in Thailand through illegal brokers, but not through legal foreign

employment agencies, have to pay exorbitant fees and stay in Thailand illegally.

The workers are facing a lack of full employment benefits and arrests are being made in Thailand for illegal work during inspections by the relevant departments.

The arrests took place in several provinces in Thailand, injuring 19 Myanmar migrant workers and 19 others were killed.

Therefore, Myanmar citi-

zens who want to go illegally to Thailand to get a job are more likely to be trafficked. Next, they could face human rights violations, lack of full protection under the law and other human rights violations.

Officials have urged migrant workers not to make illegal entries as they may face various difficulties.

Full legal protection of workers' rights can be achieved by going abroad legally, officials said.

Illegal timbers, chemicals, motorbikes and textile seized

SUPERVISED by the Anti-Illegal Trade Steering Committee, action is being taken under the law against illegal trades across the country.

An inspection team led by the Forest Department under the Mon State Anti-Illegal Trade Task Force conducted inspections on the road of Kyaikmaraw-Mudon in Kyaikmaraw Township and seized K2,783,120 worth of 13.9156 tonnes of illegal iron-wood. Police opened a file on this case under the Forest Law.

Similarly, on 11 May, the Myanmar Industrial Port Container Checkpoint captured K4,580,000 worth of thinner solution, which was not declared in the imported declaration, and charged under the Customs Law.

In addition, Myanmar Police Force seized K1,495,620 worth of illegal teak in Sagaing Region and action was taken under the Forest Law. On 12 May, the MPF inspection team confiscated K600,000 worth of an unregistered Kawasaki Esterlla motorbike and action was taken under the Export/Import Law.

Similarly, on the same day, the inspection team on duty conducted inspections at the Kawkareik (Tadakyoe) Combined Checkpoint and captured K4,162,500 worth of textile that did not show any official documents. The action was taken under the Customs Law.

Afterwards, the Bago Region Forest Department confiscated 2.9322 tonnes of illegal teak at an estimated value of K879,660 and took action under the Forest Law.

Therefore, from 10 to 12 May, seven arrests were made (an estimated value of K14,500,900), according to the Anti-Illegal Trade Steering Committee. — MNA

Fresher welcome, subject orientation ceremonies held at technological and computer universities

FRESHER welcome and subject orientation ceremonies were held respectively yesterday at 60 technological and computer universities under the Department of Advanced Science and Technology (DAST) of the Ministry of Science and Technology.

A total of 57,218 – 40,447 students in 33 technological universities, and 16,771 students in 27 universities of computer studies will attend since the university reopening period across the country.

A total of 1,884 first-year undergraduate students were warmly welcomed to relevant universities by rectors and deputy pro-rectors and faculty members at the fresher welcome and subject orientation ceremonies were held on 12 May.

Not only undergraduate and postgraduate courses were opened at technological and computer universities but also master and doctoral programmes were opened at 33 technical universities and 27 universities of computer studies across the country.

Moreover, the University of Information Technology opened for engineering (honours) firstyear students in the 2019-2020 Academic Year, the third year to fourth-year (honours) students in the 2021-2022 Academic Year and the students who have been passed the matriculation exam in 2020 of the 2022-2023 Academic Year.

The technological universities and computer universities under the Department of Advanced Science and Technology (DAST) of the Ministry of Science and Technology admitted students for the first year of the 2022-2023 Academic Year on 20 April and for the programmes of the 2019-2020 and 2021-2022 academic years on 2 May. — MNA

Sino-Myanmar bilateral trade plunges by 32.9 per cent in April

THE statistics released by the Ministry of Commerce indicated that the value of border trade between Myanmar and a major trade partner China dropped by 32.9 per cent (US\$69.307 million) in April 2022 compared to the corresponding period last year.

The value of Myanmar-China border trade in all five border areas touched a low of \$141.343 million in April, comprising exports worth \$128.94 million and imports worth \$12.399 million

The figure significantly plummeted from over \$210.65 million recorded in the yearago period.

Last month, border trade values amounted to \$100.9 million through Muse border, \$17.424 million via Lweje, \$5.3 million via Chinshwehaw, \$16.259 million via Kampai-

ti, and over \$1.43 million via Kengtung. The Commerce Ministry's data showed a drop in trade value through Muse and Chinshwehaw border areas between Myanmar and China.

China banned Myanmar

trucks and drivers to enter its side because of the COVID-19 protocols and only Chinese short-haul drivers are allowed to transport the goods. Another trade barrier is the red tape of the COVID regulations, causing trade delays, according to Muse Rice Wholesale Centre.

The transport delays caused damage to the quality of the goods and hike up the transportation rate, said a trader from the Muse border.

Only if China lifted COVID restrictions can Muse border trade revive, said U Min Thein, vice-chair of the Muse Rice Wholesale Depot.

China shut down all the checkpoints linking to a major border post Muse amidst the COVID-19 pandemic. Of the checkpoints, Kyinsankyawt has resumed trading activity from 26 November on a trial run. Myanmar daily delivers rubber, various beans and pulses, dried plum, watermelon, muskmelon and other food commodities to China through Kyinsankyawt post with about 30 trucks.

Myanmar has opened five border trade zones with China; Muse, Lweje, Kampaiti, Chinshwehaw and Kengtung. The majority of the trade is carried out through the Muse land border, the Ministry of Commerce's data showed. — GNLM

Black sesame market sluggish on low prices

THE market of black sesame seeds is seemingly inactive as the prevailing market price is not profitable for the traders, said traders from Mandalay.

"It is one week that the market is sluggish. The inventory is low at present. Some growers are thinking of reducing the sowing acreage on the low prices," said a trader from Mandalay market.

The prices of black sesame seeds hit over K200,000 per 45-viss bag in early 2022. The prevailing price is approximately K185,000 per viss.

Among the agricultural products that are allowed to be exported through the bor-

der posts, oil crops (peanut and sesame seeds) except black sesame are temporarily suspended for exports to secure local consumption. The Trade Department released a statement on 9 May to discuss with the related organizations to ensure peanut and sesame export ban.

Myanmar's sesame was earlier exported to China, South Korea, Japan, Singapore and China Taipei (Taiwan). However, it is now relying solely on China through sea trade and the shipments to other foreign countries have certain difficulties.

Additionally, some grow-

ers turned to other oil crops over the sesame owing to the high input burden and low price

Sesame is cultivated in the country throughout the year. Magway Region, which has gained a reputation as the oil pot of Myanmar, is the main producer of sesame seeds. The seeds are also grown in Mandalay and Sagaing regions.

Of the cooking oil crops grown in Myanmar, the acreage under sesame seed is the highest, accounting for 51.3 per cent of the overall oil crop plantations. About 600,000-800,000 tonnes of sesame seeds are yearly produced. — KK/GNLM

Pure gold price down by K50,000 per tical within 2 weeks

THE prices of pure gold fall by K50,000 per tical (0.578 ounce, or 0.016 kilogramme) within the two weeks, according to Yangon Region Gold Entrepreneurs Association (YGEA).

The price of 24-carat gold stood at K2,024,000 per tical on 2 May, whereas it slightly falls to K1,976,500 per tical on 12 May.

The domestic gold prices plunged following the price slip in the global market.

The global gold price is valued at \$1,854 per ounce at present, which fell from \$1,888 per ounce.

The figures showed a slight decrease of \$34 per ounce in the past two weeks. Consequently, the domestic gold price was also down by K47,500 per tical.

Moreover, YGEA also decided on 4 May to import raw gold from foreign countries in the coming rainy season not to fall short of raw metal supply.

Additionally, gold traders and retailers are urged to make gold transactions by adding up to K5,000 to the price set by YGEA.

In a bid to stabilize the gold market, gold transactions had better made according to the reference rate of the Central Bank of Myanmar (K1,850), according to the CBM's statement released on 3 April.

YGEA called for an urgent meeting on 8 April. The meeting determined to carry out gold transactions depending on the CBM's reference exchange rate. However, it has not come into force yet, said U Myo Myint, chair of YGEA.

The US dollar stands at around K2,000 in the unofficial black market.

Additionally, the domestic gold price is highly correlated with the global gold price, YGEA stated.

During the end of September 2021, a dollar value hits an all-time high of over K3,000 in the gold exchanges and consequently, the pure gold reached a record high of K2.22 million per tical in history. — NN/GNLM

Risks of Psychological Warfare, Fake News and Disinformation To Care About

ELIBERATED dissemination of fake news and disinformation on social networks are daily witnessed. Particularly, individuals and organizations from local and abroad are spreading the fabricated news and disinformation with the mixture of truths and falsities created by using texts, photos and video footages using various accounts claiming as media agencies on Facebook.

Like a law of propaganda "Repeat a lie often enough and it becomes the truth", when the people repeatedly hear and read the fake news and misinformation again and again daily, the people of social network users eventually fall victims to the 'illusory truth effect' and they often come to believe such news reports are true. It is also learnt that even the ones who have carefully used the social networks encounter such situations. Such situation signals that Myanmar is certainly under the attacks of psychological warfare.

The psychological warfare is no more a new subject as it has been one of the approaches used in battles since prehistoric times to weaken the morale of opponents. To present its brief history, during the Pellucidum battle that occurred between Persian Empire and Egyptians around BC 525, the Persian side had used cats as psychological tools against the Egyptians. The reason behind was that the ancient Egyptians had regarded the cats as sacred animals according to their religious faiths and spells. It was an instance of using a religious belief as a psychological tactic.

During the First World War, the British forces used the psychological warfare means of distributing pamphlets. In the Second World War, the means of radio broadcasts was widely used for propaganda. Nowadays, the Internet and social media networks play major role in psychological warfare. Digital platforms are widely used in applying various forms of psywar including disseminating fake news and misinformation to change the ideologies, creeds, cultures and concepts of targeted countries, societies and groups.

Recalling what occurred in a regional country located near Myanmar, the Phoenix Program and Chieu Hoi Programme run by United States during the Vietnam War were found to be prominent ones. The Phoenix Programme had certain components ranging from infiltration into Viet Cong personnel and actions of interrogation and tortures to weaken their morale to violent assassinations. Chieu Hoi Programme primarily aimed at defections of the enemy. As the outcomes of Phoenix Program, 81,740 civilians and Viet Cong personnel were arrested and 25,369 assassinated. The Chieu Hoi Programme resulted in 101,511 defections of Viet Cong.

At present, Myanmar also encounters the tactics of psychological warfare similar to the Phoenix and Chieu Hoi programs run by US in the Vietnam War. It is a crucial time for national security because such psychological warfare tactics are obviously found using in online media platforms and social networks.

The Tatmadaw's assumption of the State responsibilities in accordance with the State constitution was shaped into the form of military coup after neglecting the root cause of using the government power to ensure the victory in the elections with premediate ballot riggings that led Myanmar to a political crisis. Following the move, the people being suffocated with the COVID-19 pandemic were also instigated to take to the streets. The rallies under the name of non-violent movement were soon morphed into riotous mobs and then start to commit violent acts in anarchic manner. At that time, an American provided online trainings of terrorism to Myanmar youths. Likewise, some Ethnic Armed Organizations-EAOs with the supports of some powerful countries provided terrorist trainings to Myanmar youths and also armed them. Such outcomes are not opportune but by the deliberate attempts of manipulators behind to make people to follow irrationally what the former wanted.

The psychological warfare provoking the terrorism, and the killings of innocent people, civil servants and Buddhist Sangha are

taking place simultaneously while such acts are continuously fuelled by fake news and misinformation. In this regard, the psychological warfare is being waged by disseminating fake news, fabrications and misinformation after providing cash assistance to one-sided lobbyists, social influencers, and some traitorous media outlets in order to provoke the acts of terrorism; encourage the terrorists; demoralize the Tatmadaw personnel, their family members, nationalists and pro-Tatmadaw people.

"Fake news" are the news reports which are fabricated using edited photos and video clips as if an event has actually occurred on ground though it really has not. For instance, the death toll figure of security force members is found to be mendaciously increased daily.

"Disinformation" are the news reports of fabrications with distorted views based on a truth event. For instance, although there were no casualties of security force members in the actual events of bombing and clash, the fake death toll was intentionally described at high number with the mixture false and true facts in disinformation.

It is the actual truth that such groundless fake news and disinformation are toxic to the people using social networks because some people weak in rationality believe in such news which provoke certain incitements. Hence, the so-called media outlets from local and abroad, that are repeatedly describing the toxic news and disinformation without reviewing them, are worth to be named as the media of nation-destruction.

According to the daily findings of FACT CHECK, a volunteering team which has watched the fake news and disinformation, it is reported that around 20 to 30 fake news are being described on Facebook

It is seen that the FACT CHECK, an impartial volunteering team, is daily reviewing the news reports described on the social media platforms of Facebook, Telegram, and Twitter, and differentiating between true and fake news. According to analytical data of the team on the recent period from 1 to 30 April 2022, there were 630 fake and fabricated news while the true news reports were only 32 on the Facebook pages of the so-called media of nation-destruction.

Out of the many fake news and disinformation assessed by the team, some news reports were found to be just fabrications without actual accidents such as the one describing that CDF-Mindat, The Youth Force and CDF-Matupi groups carried out remote-mine attacks on the military convoy on the way from Mindat town to Matupi town of Chin state on 5 April leaving over 30 soldiers of

military council killed; the news report of Khit Thit media on 11 April claiming that at least 25 soldiers of military council were dead during the clash that occurred between military forces and the PDF members near Kya-Oh village, Pauk town of Magway region; and the news report of DVB on 19 April claiming that a combined forces comprising four PDF alliances carried out remote-mine attacks against the troops of military council that left Monywa town of Sagaing region at 8:20 am leaving 16 military council soldiers killed and a jammer car destroyed.

For the instances of disinformation, the news report posted by Khit Thit on 2 April describing that PDF carried out remote-mine attacks against the force comprising military council soldiers and Pyu-Saw-Htee members near Wayin Nge village and Sein Lan office of Tanze township of Sagaing region leaving a military vehicle destroyed in fire and 15 soldiers and Pyu-Saw-Htee members dead. In reality, the incident of remote-mine attack actually took place but no military vehicle was on fire while only a policeman was killed and a militiaman injured. Similarly, another news report described by the DVB on 7 April claimed that PDF carried out a remote-mine attack against a military convoy of five vehicles on Mandalay-Monywa road causing deaths of 30 to 40 soldiers. Although the remote-mine attack incident actually occurred, only two soldiers were injured and no death case was reported.

The NUG exile group has certain intention of disseminating such fake news and disinformation repeatedly. It is surely to convince people that NUG is winning everywhere and the peace and stability become deteriorating across the country as per their course of utter devastation. Likewise, their move is also to motivate the PDF terrorists who are totally hopeless without direction as well as their supporters, to encourage the acts of terrorism, and to collect money from domestic and foreign donors on the pretext of supporting PDF.

Temporary power outage occurs due to relocation of unsafe power lines during construction of Yangon-Pathein highway

THE 33kV Hlinethaya-Hlinethaya (1, 2) Feeder, funded by the Yangon Region Government, is being constructed in Hlinethaya Township, Yangon North District, from 6:00 am to 9:00 am on 13 May to replace the unsaved power lines while expanding the Yangon-Pathein highway.

The Yangon Electric Power Corporation has announced that 33kV Nawade + Shwe Thanlwin Feeder will be temporarily shut down from 9 am to 1 pm on 15 May.

During the temporary shutdown, limited power outages will occur in some parts of Hlinethaya (East) and Hlinethaya (West) townships, but there will be no power outages in important areas, officials said.

In addition, the Yangon City Development Committee performed the cutting and clearing of branches adjacent to the 33kV power line provided by the Department of Engineering (Water and Sanitation) to the Lagunbyin

Officials have also arranged 33kV Hlinethaya West Joint Office to get backup power and 33kV Hlinethaya-Kungyangon power line for Auto Recloser installation.

STUDENTS who want to relocate to international and private schools must sit placement tests in the third week of May, according to the Ministry of Education.

When applying for the placement test, students must take the test for a lower class

than the class they intend to attend. The test will include subjects according to the curriculum set by the Ministry of Education for each level. The level and the age of the student must be appropriate, and the original school recommendation or school certificate,

original and a copy of the birth certificate must be presented.

233 Myanmar nationals arrested for entering Thailand illegally

THAI authorities have arrested 233 Myanmar illegal immigrants in Prachuap Khiri Khan province and Kanchanaburi province, according to their yesterday's announcement.

On 10 and 11 May, a total of 158 Myanmar nationals, including 89 men and 69 women, were arrested in three districts in Thailand.

A total of 75 Myanmar people including 39 male workers, 36 female workers and 10 guides were arrested in seven places in five other provinces.

The detainees were from Bago, Dawei, Mandalay, Yangon, Myeik, Magway and Mawlamyine Townships and had to pay between 20,000 and 25,000 baht to enter Thailand. No suspects were found

to be infected with the COVID-19 virus.

On 6 May, Thai Police and Special Forces found a 35-year-old Myanmar man dead with gunshot wounds at the back and head on a Thai highway.

Two other Myanmar men and one woman were shot near the scene, and four Myanmar men and six women were found hiding nearby. According to investigators, they entered Thailand illegally, fell into a car to cross a checkpoint and were shot while driving at high speed.

Thai authorities have arrested a 51-year-old gunman responsible for local administration, according to the announcement on 8 May. — TWA/GNLM

North Korea declares Covid-19 'severe emergency': state media

NORTH Korea on Thursday confirmed its first-ever case of Covid-19, with state media declaring it a "severe national emergency incident" after more than two years of purportedly keeping the pandemic at bay.

The official KCNA news agency said samples taken from patients sick with fever in Pyongyang on Sunday were "consistent with" the virus' highly transmissible Omicron variant. The country's top officials, including leader Kim Jong Un, held a crisis politburo meeting to discuss the outbreak and announced they would imple-

ment a "maximum emergency" virus control system.

KCNA said Kim told the meeting that "the goal was to eliminate the root within the shortest period of time."

"He assured us that because of the people's high political awareness ... we will surely overcome the emergency and win the emergency quarantine project," it said.

Kim called for tighter border controls and lockdown measures, telling citizens "to completely block the spread of the malicious virus by thoroughly blocking their areas in all cities and counties across the country", KCNA said.

All business and production activities will be organized so each work unit is "isolated" to prevent the spread of disease, it added.

The impoverished nuclear-armed nation has been behind a rigid self-imposed coronavirus blockade since early 2020 to protect itself from the pandemic, with the economy suffering and trade all but stopped.

North Korea had not confirmed a single case of coronavirus until Thursday.—AFP

10% suffer COVID-19 aftereffects 1 yr after discharge: survey

AROUND 10 per cent of people admitted to hospitals due to coronavirus symptoms continued to suffer from aftereffects a year after they were discharged, a recent survey compiled by a health ministry research group showed.

The most prevalent lingering symptom was reduced muscle strength at 7.4 per cent, followed by difficulty in breathing at 4.4 per cent and lethargy at 3.5 per cent, according to the survey.

Individuals experiencing a lost or altered sense of smell accounted for 1.6 per cent, while those with altered taste were recorded at 1.0 per cent. Some people suffered from multiple symptoms.

The survey covered 693 people with moderate or severe COVID-19 symptoms who were admitted to hospitals between September 2020 and July 2021. Individuals who continued to consult medical facilities about symptoms that appeared to be aftereffects one year after being discharged stood at 9.8 per cent.

While the rate of people complaining about lingering symptoms is declining with the passing of time, aftereffects "remain in some," said Akihito Yokoyama, leader of the Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare group.— Kyodo

Rapid scale-up of COVID-19 vaccination delivers greater health benefits

EARLIER start dates and rapid scale-up of COVID-19 vaccination delivered greater health benefits in terms of hospitalizations and deaths averted, and were more cost-effective in Africa, a newly published study by the Africa Centres for Disease Control and Prevention has disclosed.

The newly released study incorporated the results of a 27-country analysis on the health and economic impact of COVID-19 vaccination.

The analysis finds that the scale-up speed, a focus on at-risk populations and the choice of COVID-19 vaccine brands are critical to structuring successful programmes in the African context.

The benefits of COVID-19 vaccines vary widely depending on the pace of roll-out, the population targeted, and the type of vaccines used in the campaigns, the research found.

The analysis also drew on research from Kenya, Nigeria, Ethiopia and South Africa.—Xinhua

US to limit next-generation COVID-19 vaccines to high-risk people without more funding: report

THE United States will have to limit the next generation of COV-ID-19 vaccines this fall to individuals at the highest risk of getting seriously sick from the virus if Congress fails to approve funding to purchase the new shots, reported CNBC on Monday.

The national broadcaster cited an official source as warning that the country faces a substantial surge of COVID-19 infections this fall as immunity from the current vaccines wanes and the Omicron variant mutates into more transmissible subvariants, and more money is needed for next-generation vaccines.

Pfizer and Moderna are developing redesigned vaccines that target the Omicron variant's mutations to boost protection against infection. As the virus has evolved over the past two years, the current shots have become less effective at preventing mild illness, though they generally still protect against severe disease.

The Food and Drug Administration is expected to make a decision by early summer at the latest on whether the country should switch to the redesigned shots for a fall vaccination campaign, with its advisory committee set to hold a meeting on 28 June to discuss the issue, according to the report.

"However, the United States currently does not have enough money to purchase the new shots for everybody" in the country ahead of the fall, and the US Senate has failed so far to pass 10 billion US dollars in additional COVID-19 funding for vaccines, therapeutics and testing, it added. — Xinhua

WHO says China's zero-Covid strategy unsustainable

CHINA'S zero-Covid strategy to defeat the pandemic is not sustainable, the World Health Organization's chief said Tuesday, adding that the WHO had told Beijing so.

Draconian measures have trapped most of Shanghai's 25 million people at home for weeks as China combats the country's worst outbreak since the pandemic began.

Yet the Shanghai lockdown has intensified, causing outrage and rare protest in the last major economy still glued to a zero-Covid policy. "When we talk about the zero-Covid strategy, we don't think that it's sustainable, considering the behaviour of the virus

now and what we anticipate in the future," Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus told a press conference.

"We have discussed about this issue with Chinese experts and we indicated that the approach will not be sustainable and considering the behaviour of the virus, I think a shift would be very important."—AFP

Biden says "discussing" whether to drop hiked tariffs on Chinese products

US President Joe Biden on Tuesday said the administration is discussing whether to drop the additional tariffs on Chinese imports imposed during the Trump administration, while noting that no decision has been made.

"We're discussing that right now. We're looking at what would have the most positive impact," Biden said in response to a question after making remarks on inflation at the Eisenhower Executive Office Building.

Following Biden's remarks, outgoing White House Press Secretary Jen Psaki said at a press briefing that the US government has already announced some tariff exclusions back in March, and it has been an "ongoing review."

"We are continuing to review where it would be advantageous to take steps that would help reduce wages — or increase wages and help certain industries that are impacted by these tariffs in a way that we don't feel is effective," Psaki told reporters. "There will be more and he's (Biden's) continuing to weigh them," Psaki said, adding that US Trade Representative Katherine Tai is leading that effort. Biden's remarks followed recent

statements by Deputy National Security Adviser Daleep Singh and Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen, who spoke about potential easing of tariffs on Chinese goods in late April. Such voices came as the United States is experiencing the highest inflation in four decades. The March consumer price index (CPI) surged 8.5 per cent from a year earlier, the largest 12-month increase since the period ending December 1981, according to data from the US Labour Department. The April CPI, set to be released on Wednesday, is expected to remain elevated.— AFP

Germany's inflation reaches alltime high at 7.4 pct in April

GERMANY'S inflation rate in April rose to 7.4 per cent amid soaring energy prices, according to confirmed figures published by the Federal Statistical Office (Destatis) on Wednesday.

"The inflation rate reached an all-time high for the second month in a row since German reunification," said Georg Thiel, president of Destatis.

A similarly high inflation rate was last recorded in Germany in autumn 1981 when mineral oil prices had sharply increased as a consequence of the war between Iraq and Iran. Prices of heating oil in April nearly doubled yearon-year, according to Destatis. Marked price increases were also recorded for motor fuels and natural gas, up 38.5 and 47.5 per cent respectively. The development of energy prices since the start of the Russia-Ukraine conflict had a "substantial impact on the inflation rate," Destatis noted.

Food prices also picked up and rose by 8.6 per cent year-onyear, accelerating significantly from an increase of 6.2 per cent in the previous month, according to Destatis. Prices for edible fats and oils rose particularly sharply at 27.3 per cent.—AFP

S.Korea logs trade deficit in first 10 days of May

SOUTH Korea logged a trade deficit in the first 10 days of this month due to a faster increase in import than export, customs office data showed Wednesday.

The trade deficit reached 3.72 billion US dollars in the 1-10 May period, up from a deficit of 2.21 billion dollars recorded in the same period of last year, according to the Korea Customs Service.

Except for February, the country has posted trade deficits this year amid the faster growth in import.

Export advanced 28.7 per cent from a year earlier to 16.05 billion dollars in the 10-day period in May, while import jumped 34.7 per cent to 19.77 billion dollars.—Xinhua

Japan books 19.68 bln USD current account surplus in March

JAPAN logged a current account surplus of 2.55 trillion yen (19.68 billion US dollars) in March, the government said in a report on Thursday, with the surplus being in the black for a second straight month. According to the Finance Ministry, the country had a goods trade deficit of 166.1 billion yen (1.28 billion dollars) and a services trade deficit of 127.7 billion yen (985.57 million dollars), among key components in the recording period.—Xinhua

UK and EU polarized over post-Brexit N.Irish trade rules

THE UK and the EU appeared on a collision course Tuesday over post-Brexit trading arrangements in Northern Ireland, after London branded them unsustainable but European leaders insisted they would not be renegotiated.

It comes as political tensions rise in the UK province

after historic elections last week saw pro-Irish nationalists Sinn Fein become the biggest party for the first time and now bid to lead a power-sharing executive.

UK Prime Minister Boris Johnson said in a call with his Irish counterpart Micheal Martin that the so-called Northern Ireland Protocol governing trade there "was not sustainable in its current form".

In the latest threat to take unilateral steps to address the "very serious" situation, he added his government "would take action to protect peace and political stability in Northern Ireland if solutions could not be found".—AFP

Scandinavian Airlines to cancel 4,000 flights this summer

SCANDINAVIAN Airlines (SAS) is set to cancel around 4,000 flights this summer, citing staff shortages and delayed deliveries of aircraft, Swedish financial daily Dagens Industri (DI) reported on Tuesday. The staff shortages are a result of the COVID-19 pandemic since around 5,000 employees were laid off as demand for international and domestic flights plummeted, DI reported.

Karin Nyman from Scandi-

navian Airlines said that most cancelled flights will be rescheduled for the same day, to avoid leaving passengers stranded.

The news about this summer's cancellations came less than three months after the airline announced it was in financial trouble. An interim financial report released in late February showed the company's earnings before tax stood at a negative 2.6 billion Swedish crowns (about 260

million US dollars) for the period November 2021-January 2022. Compared with the same period in 2019 — before the pandemic struck — total revenues were down 42 per cent. SAS, therefore, announced it would "aggressively pursue reducing costs" by 7.5 billion Swedish crowns annually, by adjusting its fleet and product offerings, among other things. (1 US dollar = 10.06 Swedish crowns)—Xinhua

Production at all four 3M factories in Shanghai resumed

ALL four factories of the US manufacturing company 3M in Shanghai had resumed production by Saturday, sources with the company said, adding that it will continue improving their production capacity.

Since the resurgence of COVID-19 cases in March in Shanghai, 3M has not suspended its East China Distribution Centre and the production of medical protective masks at its Caohejing base to ensure the stable supply of anti-epidemic materials, the company said.

"3M has received strong support from the governments at all levels in Shanghai," said Ding Hongyu, president of 3M China. "Now, 3M is gathering the strength of the entire company to actively deploy resources, so as to ensure the closed-loop production of epidemic prevention supplies."

According to a press con-

ference held on 5 May, over 70 per cent of Shanghai's 1,800-plus major enterprises had resumed work and production as the city's epidemic situation eased.

Key industrial chains such as automobiles, integrated circuits and biomedicine continued to recover and increase production capacity, while leading enterprises have maintained stable production.

On Monday, Shanghai reported 234 confirmed locally transmitted COVID-19 cases and 2,780 local asymptomatic cases, according to the municipal health commission.—Xinhua

East China's Zhejiang sees robust foreign trade in Jan.-April

THE foreign trade value of eastern China's Zhejiang Province rose 19.3 per cent year on year to 1.43 trillion yuan (about 212.5 billion US dollars) in the first four months of this year, according to Hangzhou Customs on Wednesday. Of the total, exports exceeded one trillion yuan, up 23 per cent year on year, while imports grew by 10 per cent to 381.6 billion yuan.

Statistics show that since March 2020, Zhejiang's foreign trade has maintained year-on-year growth for 26 consecutive months. From January to April, Zhejiang's foreign trade with the top three trading partners, the European Union, the United States and the Association of Southeast Asian Nations, registered an increase of 24.1 per cent,

25.6 per cent and 15.9 per cent respectively, accounting for 45 per cent of the province's total.

Meanwhile, the province's imports and exports to the markets of Belt and Road countries and member countries under the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership rose by 24.2 per cent and 10.5 per cent, respectively.—Xinhua

Ukraine car cable output close to pre-war levels at Leoni

CAR cable production at Leoni's factories in Ukraine is almost back to normal, the German supplier said Wednesday, after production stoppages caused by the Russian invasion rattled the auto industry.

Output figures from plants in western Ukraine were "approaching pre-war levels again" after a "rapid resumption" of production following the outbreak of the war at the end of February, Leoni said in a statement.

Ukraine is the main European supplier of the wiring harnesses that run through cars and act as a sort of central nervous system for the vehicle.

The Russian invasion and the disruption to supplies of the key part led to production stops among Europe's top auto manufacturers.—AFP

Russia car sales sink 78.5% in April

NEW car sales in Russia sank by over 78 per cent in April, industry data showed Wednesday, after the country was hit by a barrage of sanctions over Moscow's military campaign in Ukraine.

Only 32,706 units were sold in April, according to the Association of European Businesses.

This was down 78.5 per cent from the same month in 2021 and followed a 60-per-cent drop in March.

The fall comes on the heels of Russian President Vladimir Putin's decision to send troops into Ukraine on 24 February.

Sales of the country's most popular and affordable brand, Lada, whose Avtovaz manufacturer is majority-owned by the Nissan-Renault group, fell 78 per cent.— AFP

Philip Morris offers US\$16 bn for Swedish smokeless tobacco firm

MARLBORO-maker Philip Morris International said Wednesday it offered \$16 billion to acquire smokeless tobacco company Swedish Match as the US group aims to move away from its traditional cigarette business.

The board of Swedish Match recommended that its shareholders accept the bid of 106 Swedish kronor per share, nearly 40 per cent above its closing share price on Monday, the companies said in separate statements.

The deal would total 161.2 billion Swedish kronor (15 billion euros).—AFP $\,$

Cannes marks its 75th year in nostalgic form

FROM Maverick to Bowie to Elvis, the Cannes Film Festival launches its 75th-anniversary edition on Tuesday with a roster full of icons from the last century.

The world's foremost film festival always tries to strike a balance between serious arthouse fare and popcorn-guzzling entertainment. It has scored some big crowd-pleasers for its diamond jubilee, with Tom Cruise coming to the French Riviera for the

European launch of "Top Gun: Maverick", the sequel to his era-defining mega-hit from 1986.

Music legends will feature prominently, with flamboyant Australian director Baz Luhrmann screening his biopic "Elvis" along with new documentaries about David Bowie ("Moonage Daydream") and rock'n'roller Jerry Lee Lewis ("Trouble in Mind" by one-half of the Coen brothers, Ethan Coen). While

those are all playing outside the main competition, there are also iconic names in the race for the top prize Palme d'Or, not least Canadian horror maestro David Cronenberg. The 79-year-old returns to his body-horror (dis)comfort zone with "Crimes of the Future", in which Kristen Stewart, Lea Seydoux and Viggo Mortensen turn gruesome surgical alterations into a sexualised performance art.—AFP

In Kyiv, boxing gyms offer chance to ease war stress

THE sound of hip hop mixes with the dull thud of fists walloping heavy bags as a group of Ukrainian boxers unleash combinations, burning off weeks of pent up stress.

"With the curfew in the city and restrictions on movement, we needed some place to blow off steam and discharge emotional tension," said Oleksandr, a 38-year-old employee of the International Red Cross in the Ukrainian capital Kyiv who did not give his family name.

"Naturally, this helps a lot," he added after wrapping up a workout involving pad work, running and several rounds hammering away at a punching bag.

Weeks after Russian forces retreated from Kyiv's suburbs, the city is slowly returning to life, where nearly two-thirds of the capital's residents have returned following the outbreak of the war

Restaurants are reopening

and pavement cafes are once again attracting customers with the arrival of a late spring, where many appear to be ignoring the occasional air raid sirens echoing through the city.

Gyms have also begun to reopen, among them the All Stars Boxing Club in downtown Kyiv.

At All Stars, trainers put boxing enthusiasts, fitness fa-

natics, and newcomers through their paces -- jumping rope, doing crunches and sparring.

For the past two decades, Ukraine has maintained a dominant presence in the boxing world, with their fighters gaining a reputation for speed, movement, and fighting IQ -- skills that also appear to have been adopted on the battlefield.—AFP

Iran archaeologists oppose bill allowing antiquities trade

IRANIAN archaeology professors have published an open letter calling on parliament to step back from a draft law that would allow trade in antiquities, Iranian media reported Wednesday.

"A group of archaeology professors from across the country called for the withdrawal of a bill that would allow the trade of ancient artefacts," the ISNA news agency reported. According to the news agency, 46 out of 290 MPs proposed the draft law earlier this week, dubbed the "optimal utilization of ancient objects and treasures".

Lawmakers said they hope to turn Iran into a "regional centre" for antiquities trade, aiming to prevent the "cheap smuggling of national heritage", ISNA said, citing the text of the draft.

Iranian media regularly report arrests of individuals accused of smuggling artefacts out of the country. In their letter, the professors strongly criticized the MPs for proposing the bill "without any consultation with official archaeological institutions".—AFP

Victims of Florida condo collapse reach \$997 mn settlement

SURVIVORS and families of people who died in last year's collapse of a beachfront condo building near Miami have reached a settlement of at least \$997 million, a lawyer for the plaintiffs said Wednesday.

"The settlement right now is \$997 million. There will be approximately another hundred million dollars that we will recover for the victims," said attorney Carlos Silva.

Part of Champlain Towers South, a 12-story building built in 1981 in Surfside, a town north of Miami Beach, came tumbling down on June 24, 2021 as dozens of residents slept inside.

Except for a teenager rescued hours after the tower collapsed, search crews found no survivors in the rubble and soon focused on recovering human remains.

A total of 98 people died in the collapse, with the last body identified nearly a month later.

A final report on the causes of the collapse has not yet been issued, although preliminary findings showed some of the building's structure appeared degraded.—AFP

Somalia registers record 39 candidates for presidential vote

SOMALIA has registered a record 39 candidates for the presidential elections on 15 May, a parliamentary committee tasked with organizing the long-delayed polls in the fragile Horn of Africa nation said Tuesday.

The election is well over a year behind schedule, marred by deadly violence and a power struggle between President Mohamed Abdullahi Mohamed, better known as Farmajo, and Prime Minister Mohamed Hussein Roble.

Lawmakers and senators will choose the next head of state inside Mogadishu's heavily-guarded airport complex in the country battling a decade-long Islamist insurgency.

The candidates include two previous presidents, Hassan Sheikh Mohamud (2012-2017) and Sharif Sheikh Ahmed (2009-2012) as well as former prime minister, Hassan Ali Khaire (2017-2020). Puntland region president Said Abdullahi Dani and a former foreign minister who also served as deputy minister, Fawzia Yusuf Adan (2012-2014) are also among those who have registered their candidacy. The winning candidate must secure the backing of two-thirds of the deputies and senators, which means a minimum of 184 votes.—AFP

Asia's biggest tennis court complex opens in Bac Ninh, ready for SEA Games 31

TENNIS COURT complex Hanaka Paris Ocean Park, a venue for SEA Games 31 competitions in the northern province of Bac Ninh, has been named Asia's biggest complex of its kind located in an urban area by the Asia Book of Records, according to the Organising Committee for SEA Games 31. The 10-ha complex was officially inaugurated by its developer Hanaka Group JSC on May 10 evening. It was built in six months at a total cost of 120 billion VND (nearly 5.2 million USD).

Located in Hanaka Paris Ocean Park in Tu Son city, the complex has seven international-standard tennis courts, including one main covered tennis court and six outdoor tennis courts with a total capacity of over 5.000 seats.

The 3,000-seat main tennis court covers a floor area of 4,348 sq.m and has a height of Association of Tennis Profes-
