The Republic of the Union of Myanmar State Administration Council: Five-Point Road Map

1. Priority will be given to fully realizing peace, stability and rule of law throughout the Union to safeguard the socioeconomic life of the people.
2. People-centred development work that enhances socioeconomic well-being will be undertaken to ensure the country's prosperity and food security.
3. Processes will further continue to consolidate a genuine, disciplined multiparty democratic system and build a Union based on democracy and federalism.
4. Priority will be accorded to work aligned with the agreements set out in the Nationwide Ceasefire Agreement, in order to achieve enduring peace for the entire nation.
5. Upon accomplishing the provisions of the state of emergency, free and fair multiparty democratic elections will be held in line with the 2008 Constitution, and further work will be undertaken to hand over State duties to the winning party in accordance with democratic standards.

LOCAL consumption of fuel needs to be reduced as much as possible to reduce spending on foreign exchange and avoid higher charges, said Vice-Chairman of Financial Commission Vice-Chairman of the State Administration Council Deputy Prime Minister Vice-Senior General Soe Win at the coordination meeting on the submission of the Union budget for the 2023-24 FY at the SAC Chairman Office in Nay Pyi Taw yesterday afternoon.

In his speech, the Vice-Senior General said that Union level organizations, Union ministries and Nay Pyi Taw Council are to discuss necessary measures of the earmarked budget of the

Union under the financial rules and regulations based on the five-point road map and 12 objectives of the SAC.

Now is the time the infection of Covid-19 can be completely controlled. So, domestic businesses are being operated as usual. Hence, it is expected that income would be earned in the 2023-24 financial year more than the 2022-23 FY. Allotment of expenditure will depend on earned income in the 2023-24 FY, and all need to properly control the budget deficit.

The government will spend the budget on salaries and allowances of public service personnel, wages, maintenance charges, so-

cial protection costs and ordinary expenditures and infrastructure costs. Hence, expenditures for education and health sectors, agriculture, livestock and transport can help develop the socioeconomic life of the people, and the development of electric power and energy sectors on priority.

About fuel consumption, the Vice-Senior General noted that now is the time the prices of fuel across the world is rising. Hence, local consumption of fuel needs to be reduced as much as possible to reduce spending on foreign exchange and avoid higher charges. This year, the Vice-Senior General underscored that fuel consumption will be scrutinized not

only for administrative measures but for industries. Ordinarily, the use of fuel will not be allowed for the construction of new offices and staff housings but it depends on regional situations as well as security measures.

The Vice-Senior General urged some ministries to openly discuss the instructions of departmental heads and the additional reports. It was known that the Ministry of Planning and Finance has comprehensively coordinated the planned budgets of departments and enterprises. But, those departments and enterprises have a chance to amend the budgets based on work requirements if necessary.

Secretary of the Financial Commission Union Minister U Win Shein reported on budgets for 2023-24 FY submitted by Union level departments and organizations whereas Deputy Minister U Maung Maung Win presented reports on the Union budget for 2023-24 FY.

Auditor-General of the Union U Tin Oo explained auditing measures over the incomes and expenditures. All meeting participants discussed their budget accounts and the financial commission secretary focused on supplementary discussions.

The meeting ended with a concluding remark by the Vice-Senior General. — MNA/TTA

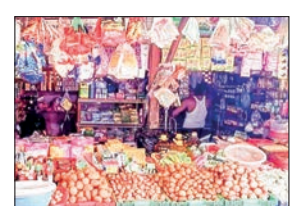

1 new case of COVID-19 reported on 9 March, total figure rises to 633,950

MYANMAR'S COVID-19 positive cases rose to **633,950** after **one** new case was reported on 9 March 2023 according to the Ministry of Health.

The total number of patients who have recovered from COVID-19 in the country reached **614,438**, including **12** new recoveries.

The death toll from COVID-19 in the country remained unchanged at **19,490** on 9-3-2023 with no new death reported from the pandemic. — GNLM

UNION Minister for International Cooperation U Ko Ko Hlaing in his capacity as Vice-Chairman 1 of the Rakhine State Stability, Peace and Development Work Coordination Committee, accompanied by Rakhine State Chief Minister U Htein Lin, led a team comprising of the officials and diplomats of ASEAN countries, China, India and Bangladesh embassies and representatives of the AHA Centre to inspect the vocational training schools, relocation of IDP camps and issuance of NVC (National Verification Card) in Rakhine State yesterday.

On arrival at the OSWSC (One Stop Women Support Centre) in Sittway Township, the Union Minister and party com-

The Border Affairs Deputy Minister also provided K10.5 million (K1.5 million each) to seven households who have not received specific shelters at the new location.

Rakhine State Security and Border Affairs Minister Colonel Kyaw Thura also handed over the hospital supplies to an official of Ohn Taw dispensary.

The Union minister and party then observed the Kyaukpyu Gas Power Plant Project.

In the afternoon, they checked the granting of NVC by the township Immigration and Population Department at Thetkaepyin IDP camp in Sittway Township.

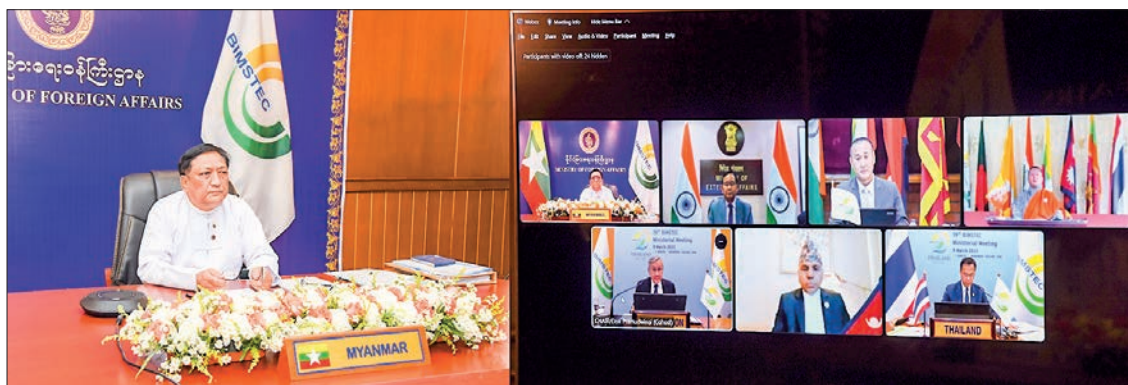
It should work together for the abandoned children to ensure their education and job opportunities and to walk through life with confidence.

DEPUTY Minister for Foreign Affairs U Kyaw Myo Htut participated in the 19th BIMSTEC Ministerial Meeting which was held virtually yesterday from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Nay Pyi Taw.

The meeting was chaired by Mr Don Pramudwinai, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Foreign Affairs of Thailand, and attended by the Ministers/State Minister of External Affairs/Foreign Affairs and External Trade of the other BIMSTEC Member

States which are Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Nepal and Sri Lanka as well as by the Secretary-General of BIMSTEC.

Mr Don Pramudwinai, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Foreign Affairs of Thailand delivered a welcome statement and other Heads of Delegation of BIMSTEC Member States made their statements respectively.

In his statement, Deputy Minister U Kyaw Myo Htut expressed his appreciation to Thailand for its tremendous efforts in

holding this important meeting and also congratulated Thailand for its excellent chairmanship which brought to the successful endorsement of "BIMSTEC Bangkok Vision 2030" and the "Rules of Procedures (RoP) for various BIMSTEC Mechanisms. He also commended the work of BIMSTEC SOM Leaders and BIMSTEC Permanent Working Committee (BPWC) for finalizing Rules of Procedures (RoP) for various BIMSTEC Mechanisms i.e., Core, Sectoral and

External Relations as well as for finalizing the ToR for Eminent Persons' Group (EPG) on the Future Directions of BIMSTEC.

Over 1,200 Myanmar food processing businesses submit over 2,200 applications to GACC within 15 months

A total of 1,244 Myanmar food processing companies and factories submitted over 2,200 applications to the General Administration of Customs of the People's Republic of China (GACC) within 15 months, according to the Ministry of Commerce.

According to GACC Decree 248 and 249, GACC registration is mandatory for food exporters starting from 1 January.

Those individuals executing edible oil, oilseeds, stuffed pastry products, edible bird's nest and related products, edible grains, grains milling industrial products and malt, fresh and dehydrated vegetables, dried beans, plant species, nuts and seeds, dried fruits, unroasted coffee and cocoa bean, special dietary food excluding milk-

based formula, functional foods, bee products, aquatic products including farm products, animal products and animal feed and livestock animals businesses need to apply for GACC licence to place their goods in China's market.

The relevant authorities for the registration with GACC are the Agriculture Department, the Livestock Breeding and Veterinary Department, the Fisheries Department and the Food and Drug Administration.

Between 1 December 2021 and 3 March 2023, 2,235 applications by 1,244 factories have been forwarded to the GACC through the Agriculture Department (2,094 applications), the Fisheries Department (118), the Livestock Breeding and Veterinary Department (14) and the

Food and Drug Administration Department (nine).

Exporters can directly access China International Trade Single Window through <https://cifer.singlewindow.cn> by creating accounts for those food groups which are not listed on those aforementioned 18 groups.

As of 24 February 2023, a total of 1,826 applications have been successful in registering with the GACC with the approval of the competent authority.

Regarding the registration of the importing companies, the Department of Animal and Plant Quarantine under the GACC will check quarantine access for the imported grains (raw coffee beans, cocoa beans, vegetables, spices, edible grains, pulses, oil crops and herbal animal prod-

The companies cannot directly proceed with registration and they need to carry out this step through competent authorities and departments

concerned by sending an email via dapq@customs.gov.cn or submitting a letter to the Chinese Embassy to Myanmar or Myanmar Embassy in China. — NN/EM

Myanmar to export 100,000 tonnes of onions in FY 2023-2024

MYANMAR aims to deliver 100,000 tonnes of onions to external markets in the 2023-2024 financial year, according to the Ministry of Commerce.

The country has planned to ship 300,000 tonnes of onions during the April-June period, 15,000 tonnes during the July-September period, 20,000 tonnes during October and December 2023 and 35,000 tonnes during January-March 2024 period to external markets. The onion output is estimated at over 1 million tonnes per year. Beyond self-sufficiency, the onions are exported to foreign countries. More than 80,000 tonnes have been shipped to global markets so far.

Myanmar's onions are purchased from Viet Nam, Thailand,

Bangladesh and China.

The supply of new onions in the markets brings down the prices. The onion prices moved in the range between K1,000 and K1,750 per viss depending on the producing areas (Seikphyu and Myittha), according to Yangon Region Chambers of Commerce and Industry (Bayintnaung Commodity Depot).

On 14 February, the Union Minister for Commerce gave a remark at the coordination meeting on the promotion of onion exports and price stability in the domestic market. There are over 170,000 acres of onions across the country, with an estimated production of 1 million tonnes. He also talked about promoting interest for the growers, having fair prices for

the consumers and boosting exports in harmony with domestic consumption. Officials from Myanmar Onion, Garlic and Culinary Crop Producers and Exporters Association also discussed the export barriers and export conditions through the seaborne and land borders and called for the government's support for market expansion.

Additionally, to effectuate sustainable development in the onion export sector, government-to-government pacts to the potential markets including the Philippines, getting easy and quick access to the phytosanitary certificates, raising awareness of Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) among the growers, promoting onion exports and domestic market stability were also highlighted at the meeting.

According to the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Irrigation's 2018-2019 FY statistics, onion cultivation covered over 170,000 acres. The yield rate was over 3,600 viss per acre. Mandalay Region accounts for 36 per cent of onion outputs in the country, while Sagaing Region, 32 per cent and Magway Region, 26 per cent. — NN/EM

Grasp the chance to generate electricity through wind power

ENERGY security is crucial for the improvement of the socioeconomic life of all citizens in Myanmar as energy is an important driving force to operate all sectors of Myanmar including manufacturing industries as well as electrify the whole nation.

These will be the first step of Myanmar-China cooperation in the electric power sector to generate electricity through wind power with the assistance of China to successfully implement the national electrification plan-NEC by 2030.

Concerning the implementation of the projects, An wind power project is scheduled to generate 150 megawatts, the Gwa wind power project, 100 megawatts and the Thandwe wind power project, 110 megawatts to be able to feed it into the national grid to electrify the whole nation. In this regard, these projects must be implemented in line with the existing law, bylaws and procedures issued by the Ministry of Natural Resources and Environmental Conservation so that environmental and social impacts can be avoided.

According to the schedules, it is necessary to strive for generating electricity from three all projects by 2025. Hence, the construction of necessary infrastructures must be undertaken in time. Among them, the Gwa wind power project is expected to generate 50 megawatts of electricity for the first phase in the coming December.

The success of implementing the wind power project will open a new page of the electrification history of the nation. If so, the electricity of wind power renewable energy will help improve the socioeconomic life of the people and the development of the nation.

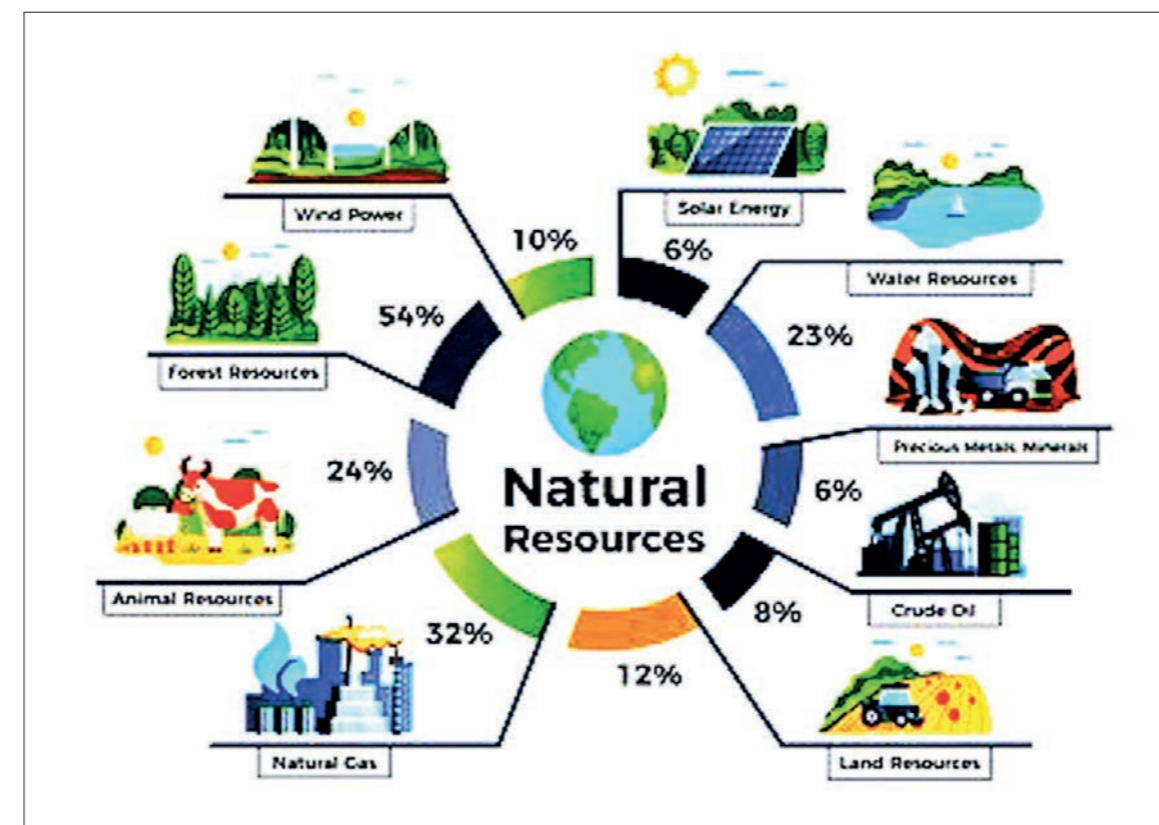

Weekly market update of dry groceries at Bayintnaung Wholesale Centre

DURING the week ending 7 March 2023, the price of palm oil significantly dropped. The price of chickpeas went up.

Onion

Bayintnaung Wholesale market saw the entry of 180,000 visses of onions on 7 March 2023. The prices moved in the range of K1,000 and K1,750 per viss depending on the quality, size and producing areas (Seikphyu and Myittha) that day.

On 7 March, 45,000 visses of onions were supplied to the Pakokku market and the highest price of onion was K1,000 per viss in the wholesale market. The price of onions from the Myittha area was K1,450 per viss.

With about 50,000 visses of onions flowing into Myingyan depot on 6 March, the onions were priced at K850-1,000 per viss.

Garlic

On 7 March, the prices stayed at K3,300-3,900 per viss depending on varieties and qualities, whereas Kyukok garlic fetched K3,600 per viss.

Potato

The prices of local potatoes from Sinphyukyun and Pakokku areas moved in the range between K1,200 and K2,100 per viss.

Chilli pepper

The wholesale prices of chilli peppers were K10,000-14,000 per viss for the long chilli pepper and Moehtaung variety. The prices of bell peppers from the Sinbyukyun area and delta regions were K14,500-16,000 per viss.

Rice

The rice price is flat for the moment. The prices stood at K5,100 per bag for summer rice grown under double-cropping system and Hnanka varieties, K57,000 for low-grade short-matured summer rice (90 days), K67,000 for Pawsan rice from Bogale, K70,000 from Pyapon, K74,000 from Myaungmya, K84,000 for old Pawsan rice from Myaungmya and K87,000 for new Pawsan rice from Shwebo area respectively.

Palm oil

The wholesale reference price of palm oil in the Yangon Region remained unchanged for two consecutive weeks. The reference price for a week from 6 and 12 March is set at K4,600. However, the wholesale market price dropped to K6,500 from K7,400 per viss. Although the reference price stayed the same for this week, the market price was down by K1,000 per viss. On 7 March, it was sold at K6,450 per viss in the wholesale market.

Pulses

The prices of various pulses stood at K1,863,000 per tonne of black gram (Fair Average Quality/RC), K2,063,000 per tonne of black gram (Special Quality/RC), K2,180,000 per tonne of pigeon pea (red gram) RC, K3,915 per viss of green gram and K4,250 -4,600 per viss of chickpea in Yangon markets. — TWA/EM

Illegal timbers, foodstuffs, consumer goods, communication devices, industrial materials and vehicles confiscated

MAUNGTAW township Customs Department under the management of the Rakhine State Illicit Trade Eradication Task Force nabbed 426 cartons of illegal foreign cigarettes worth K2,130,000 at the Kanyintaw creek in Pyathat village, according to Hlabawsa Police Station on 6 March. The action was taken under Customs procedures.

In addition, a combined team seized a total of 5.396 tonnes of illegal timbers worth K188,860 from a Hino auto (approximately K5.5 million) near Uto village on Yangon-Pyay Road in Taikkyi township and the action was taken under the Forest Law.

The on-duty team confiscated 21 kinds of goods including (Wireman and Saga PVC pipes) worth K104,423,497 at the Asia World Port container checkpoint on 6 March, and six kinds of goods worth K10 million at the Yangon International Airport (Import Desk) on 7 March including TIT Oberron Poly Screw 5.5 mm packet. The action was taken under Customs procedures.

Two kinds of goods (including 15,270 kilogrammes of the evaporator) worth K24,350,250 on 7 March and a Cheng Long tractor-head and a trailer worth K70 million at the No 2 Highway junction on Yangon-Hpa-an road. The action was taken under Customs procedures.

On 7 March, the Muse district illicit goods prevention team at the Sinphyu checkpoint in Muse township seized four kinds of goods (including wireless routers) worth K25.5 million from a Toyota Alphard (approximately K16 million) that were smuggled from China and 21 Oppo AB 2020 mobile phones and 100 various (used) mobile phones worth K6.23 million without official documents from a passenger who returned to Myanmar from Ruili, China. The action was taken under Customs procedures.

An unregistered Hero Honda 100 motorbike worth K150,000 was seized in Tamu township and an unregistered Isuzu car worth K2 million was captured in Sagaing township. The action was taken under the Export and Import Law.

A total of 4.93 tonnes of illegal teak worth K3,253,800 was seized in Homalin township and the action was taken under the Forest Law.

Therefore, 15 arrests (estimated value of K282,366,659) were made on three consecutive days from 6 to 8 March, according to the Illicit Trade Eradication Steering Committee. — MNA/MKKS

this shipment is the fourth batch. They were also claimed in line with the Customs procedures on the goods' arrival date.

The importation of the EV charger is exempted from Customs tariffs to enhance the electric vehicle sector in the domestic auto market.

The charging stations have started to run at Thabyaygon market in Nay Pyi Taw on recent days. Moreover, the construction of the charging stations in five townships in Yangon city and on the Yangon-Mandalay Expressway is underway. — TWA/EM

Over K4 bln worth of stimulant tablets seized in Tachilek

OVER K4 billion worth of stimulant tablets were captured in Tachilek township in Shan State (East), Myanmar Police Force stated.

A combined team consisting of members of the Security Force examined a Nissan diesel 12-wheel auto driven by Sai Aung Latt accompanied by Wai Yan Htun heading to Tachilek from Kengtung at the Mae Yang checkpoint in Tachilek township at noon on 4 March.

Officials captured 10,170,000 stimulant tablets worth K4.068 billion in the yellow polyethylene bags that were hidden in onions and groceries in the car. After interro-

gation, the offenders admitted the seized drugs were carried from Mongping to Tachilek.

Police took legal action

India's agriculture under spell of looming heatwaves

INDIA'S agricultural sector has been facing great challenges as the country's meteorological department predicts a hotter summer this year.

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) recently warned of a hotter-than-usual March, April and May in most parts of northeast India, east and central India, and some parts of northwest India.

This in turn increases the likelihood of heat-

waves occurring over many regions of central and northwest India.

Experts said the enhanced probability of the occurrence of a heatwave during March to May season is likely to hit farm production and hike food prices in India.

The South Asian country was gripped by record heat in February with an average maximum temperature of 29.66 degree Celsius.—

Disaster to destination: Fukushima woos tourists with snow

TOURIST Benjamin Tuffy's family spent their winter holidays in Japan's picture-perfect snow. But they weren't at the country's famed ski resorts in Hokkaido or Nagano — they picked Fukushima.

It's a choice officials hope is becoming increasingly popular as they market the region's snow resorts and try to shed the stigma that lingers more than a decade after the 2011 nuclear disaster.

Fukushima's ski industry was already struggling with warm winters and a decline in domestic visitors when a tsunami triggered the worst nuclear disaster since Chernobyl.

Officials worked hard to attract foreign visitors despite the disaster, but then the pandemic struck and border closures kept tourists away for more than two years. — AFP

Panama, Canadian group agree to reopen major copper mine

PANAMA and Canadian giant First Quantum Minerals announced on Wednesday a deal to reopen a major copper mine whose operations had been suspended for three months over a tax

dispute.

Work at the Cobre Panama pit, the largest mine in Central America, was shut down in December after the two sides failed to reach an agreement on a new con-

tract, in which Panama wanted to increase by tenfold the amount of tax and royalties First Quantum Minerals paid for the concession.

The two sides said they had "agreed on the

final text of the (new) concession contract that will govern the long-term operations of the Cobre Panama Project," said the statement.

The new, renewable 20-year contract envisag-

es "minimum income" of \$375 million for the Panamanian state, some 10 times the amount in the previous contract signed in 1997.

The mine's closure put at risk the jobs of 8,000

people either employed directly or indirectly in the pit's operations.

During the near three-month standoff, those affected protested several times in the capital Panama City. — AFP

JAL cancels cheap domestic ticket sale after surge in website traffic

JAPAN Airlines Co said Thursday it has cancelled a special campaign that offered domestic one-way tickets for 6,600 yen (\$48) each after its website suffered a glitch caused by a surge in people trying to access the promotion.

The malfunction, which caused a slow internet connection for those trying to access the website, also made it difficult for customers to purchase or reserve normal tickets. The airline announced it was unlikely to hold a similar sale for the foreseeable future.

"We sincerely apologize for any inconven-

ience caused," JAL said in a comment.

The website began experiencing problems at around 11:50 pm on Wednesday, just before the tickets were due to go on sale, with poor connectivity continuing for about 19 hours before the airline announced it was restored at around 6:35 pm Thursday.

Kremlin rejects Nord Stream report as 'diversion'

RUSSIA rejected reports Wednesday that a "pro-Ukrainian group" with no official ties to the government in Kyiv may have carried out an attack on the Nord Stream gas pipelines last year.

Four large gas leaks were discovered on the pipelines linking Russia and Germany last September, with Moscow and the West blaming each other for "sabotage".

The report in the New York

Times did not give the source for the intelligence, or name the group that could be responsible, but said officials had seen no evidence implicating Ukraine President Volodymyr Zelensky.

"It's clear the people who orchestrated the attack want to create a diversion. This is clearly a well-coordinated media campaign," Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov said in comments carried by state-run agency RIA

Novosti.

"This whole story isn't just weird. It reeks of a monstrous crime," Peskov added.

Russia said it is being sidelined from probes being carried out by Swedish, Danish and German authorities, which have not pinned the blame on any one country or actor.

"We are still not allowed to participate in the investigation," Peskov said.—AFP

Strikes target Ukraine's Kharkiv, Odesa regions: officials

STRIKES targeted Ukraine's eastern Kharkiv region and the southern Odesa region, local officials said Thursday.

For months Russia has been pummeling key facilities in Ukraine with missiles and drones, disrupting water, heating

and electricity supplies for millions of people. "The enemy made about 15 strikes on the city and region. The occupiers once again targeted critical infrastructure facilities," Kharkiv governor Oleg Synegeubov said on social media.

"According to preliminary information, a private residential building in the Kharkiv region was hit," he said.

Synegeubov added that information on victims and the scale of the damage was being "clarified".

In the region's main city of Kharkiv, mayor Igor Terekhov said "energy infrastructure" had been targeted and there were "problems" with electricity in some parts of the city.—AFP

NATO chief warns Bakhmut may fall in coming days

NATO Secretary-General Jens Stoltenberg warned Wednesday the eastern Ukrainian city of Bakhmut might fall to Russia in the coming days following months of intense fighting.

His remarks came as Russia's Wagner mercenary group, which has spearheaded the attack on Bakhmut, claimed to have captured the eastern bank of the industrial town, devastated in the longest battle since Moscow invaded Ukraine a year ago.

Wagner chief and Kremlin ally Yevgeny Prigozhin said on social media Wednesday that his forces "have taken all of

the eastern part of Bakhmut", a salt-mining town with a pre-war population of 80,000.

The intense fighting around Bakhmut has been the longest and bloodiest in Russia's more than year-long invasion, which has devastated swathes of Ukraine and displaced millions of people.

"What we see is that Russia is throwing more troops, more forces and what Russia lacks in quality they try to make up in quantity," Stoltenberg told reporters in Stockholm on the sidelines of an EU defence ministers meeting.—AFP

Three suspected militants killed by Israel undercover unit

THREE Palestinians were shot dead by Israeli border police in the occupied West Bank on Thursday, the Palestinian health ministry said, with an Israeli minister saying the suspected militants fired on the undercover officers first.

The deadly raid came just hours before Pentagon chief Lloyd Austin was due in Israel for talks and after the United Nations urged both sides to end the cycle of violence in the West Bank "immediately".

The Palestinian ministry announced the "martyrdom"

of three men shot by Israeli forces in Jaba, near the flash-point northern city of Jenin.

Israel's far-right National Security Minister Itamar Ben-Gvir, who is responsible for the border police, praised the undercover officers for "taking out the despicable terrorists, who opened fire at our fighters".

The health ministry identified the dead men as Sufyan Fakhoury, 26, Ahmed Fashafsha, 22, and Nayef Malaysha, 25. It did not provide further details.—AFP

Biden throws down 2024 gauntlet with populist budget

PRESIDENT Joe Biden will present what amounts to his expected 2024 reelection pitch Thursday with the unveiling of a proposed budget protecting free healthcare for the elderly, while taxing wealthy Americans to help slash the national deficit.

The Democrat's speech in Philadelphia will throw down the gauntlet to Republicans. They insist the priority is cutting the deficit without tax raises, but have yet to say what expenses they'd reduce instead.—AFP

Italian cabinet to meet near deadly shipwreck site

ITALIAN Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni will hold a cabinet meeting Thursday near the site of a deadly shipwreck, as a debate rages over whether the right-wing government's migration policies cost lives.

Meloni is expected to pay homage to the victims of the 28 February disaster, in which at least 72 people died when the overcrowded boat they were travelling on sank in stormy weather just off Calabria.

Grief in Cutro and Crotona, the towns nearest the shipwreck, is still raw, with relatives arriv-

ing from afar to claim their dead and bodies still this week being spotted out at sea or washed up on beaches.

Meloni's arrival follows an appeal by Crotona mayor Vincenzo Voce, who Saturday said the community, "struck by immense pain, has waited for a message from you, a call, a sign, which has not come".

Far-right Meloni's Brothers of Italy party won elections last year on a pledge to curb sea arrivals, and the ruling coalition, which includes Matteo Salvini's League, has clamped down on

migrant rescue charities.

Critics say the government's policy of treating migrant boats in the Central Mediterranean -- the world's most dangerous crossing -- as a law enforcement issue, rather than a humanitarian one, may have fatally delayed the rescue last month.

Meloni and Interior Minister Matteo Piantedosi have rejected accusations they failed to intervene to save the boat, which set off from Türkiye and was carrying Afghan, Iranian, Pakistani and Syrian nationals.— AFP

Canada's first Indigenous governor-general decries online abuse

CANADA'S first Indigenous governor-general, Mary Simon, denounced Wednesday racist and sexist abuse that led her to block comments on her official social

media accounts.

A sampling of the remarks were highlighted in a video posted on her Instagram account, calling her a "treacherous bitch",

"a worthless piece of meat", "trash", various farm animals and a vulgar slang for women's genitals.

Other comments insulted her Indigenous heritage and her appearance.

"The reality is that women — particularly those in leadership positions, high-profile women, Indigenous women and girls, women from ethnic minorities, and 2SLGBTQI+ individuals — are threatened every day online and on social media, and in their daily lives as well," Simon said in a statement marking International Women's Day.

Two spirits, or 2S, is an umbrella term used by North American Indigenous people for gay, lesbian or transgender. — AFP

Use post-quake goodwill to boost Syria peace process: UN

THE post-earthquake goodwill that helped unblock aid deliveries in Syria should be applied at the political level to help advance efforts to end the country's 12-year conflict, the UN said Wednesday.

"The status quo cannot be acceptable," Geir Pedersen, the UN special envoy to Syria, told reporters in Geneva.

The catastrophic 7.8 magnitude earthquake that struck Turkey and Syria last month, killing more than 50,000 people, provided a "wake-up call to the

world that the Syrian tragedy is far from over," he said.

The quake came nearly 12 years into Syria's civil war which has devastated swathes of the country, killed nearly half a million people and displaced millions more. In northwest Syria, where nearly 6,000 people were killed by the February tremor, the immensity of the earthquake tragedy helped shift long-stuck positions to facilitate getting aid into rebel-held areas in the northwest of the country. More

border crossings were opened to facilitate aid shipments from Türkiye, and efforts were made to crank up aid deliveries from government-held areas into the rebel-held northwest.

The United States and the European Union have also eased sanctions to ensure the aid could flow in unencumbered. Pedersen hailed that "in the aftermath of the earthquakes, humanitarian steps from all sides have moved beyond previous positions, even if temporarily."—AFP

French Senate votes to raise retirement age from 62 to 64

FRANCE'S Senate voted Thursday to raise the retirement age by two years to 64, as the government moves to overhaul the country's pensions system in the face of strong opposition from labour unions.

The conservative-dominated legislative body voted in favour of a decisive article to raise the age of retirement by 201 votes to 115.

Debate will resume later on Thursday over a controversial amendment to the bill.—AFP

Nigeria postpones local state election after court ruling

NIGERIA'S electoral agency said on Wednesday it had postponed a weekend governorship election by one week following a court decision over machines used in voting tallies.

The so-called BVAS machines are at the centre of a legal dispute over last month's contested presidential election which results show Nigeria's ruling APC party candidate won, but the opposition claims was marred by massive tampering.—AFP

Kane bemoans another trophyless season for Spurs

HARRY Kane said Tottenham "should be winning trophies" and not settling for a top-four finish in the Premier League after they crashed out of the Champions League.

Spurs drew 0-0 with AC Milan at home on Wednesday to lose their last-16 tie 1-0 on aggregate.

That followed a dismal FA Cup defeat to Championship side Sheffield United and a loss at Wolves that weakened Tottenham's grip on fourth place in the Premier League. Defeat against Milan ensured Tottenham will complete a 15th season without silverware. Kane, who broke the club's all-time goalscoring record earlier this season, was adamant that Spurs need to be doing more than just challenging for the top four, which ensures qualification for the Champions League.

The 29-year-old England captain is out of contract at the end of next season and realistically has one last chance to sign for an elite club that will guarantee him the chance to win regular trophies. Asked whether a top-four finish is enough, Kane said: "I don't think so. Where we're at as a club, we should be winning trophies. That's always the aim." — AFP

New South Korea coach Klinsmann 'felt for Son' at World Cup

NEW South Korea coach Jürgen Klinsmann wants to get Son Heung-min firing and smiling again, saying Thursday he "felt for him" at the World Cup.

Son won last season's Premier League Golden Boot but then struggled through the Qatar World Cup with a facial fracture and has been far from his best this term at Tottenham.

As a former Tottenham forward himself and now coach of South Korea, German legend Klinsmann has taken a keen interest in Son's faltering form for club and country.

The 58-year-old told his introductory press conference in

Paju, near Seoul: "As a former Tottenham player I watch almost all the games from Tottenham and so I am a big fan of Sonny, there's no doubt.

"But I think this is a normal period that every player goes through, little ups and downs.

"I can give him encouragement and the motivation to enjoy himself and whatever role and however he plays on the field," Klinsmann added.

Klinsmann will see the 30-year-old Son when he takes charge of South Korea for the first time with a home friendly against Colombia on March 24.—AFP
