YGN palm oil wholesale reference rate sees small rebound this week ending 2 June

YR prepares with personnel, equipment for natural disaster response



Preparations are underway for immediate response to disasters in Yangon Region.

CCORDING to Secretary U Nyi Nyi Min of the Yangon Region government, 3,056 rescue personnel and machines are on standby for immediate response to search and rescue operations in the event of natural disasters, including storms, in Yangon Region.

The standby machines include 210 tipper trucks, five 12-wheeled vehicles, 12 loaders, six excavators, two dozers, and 14 cranes. Additionally, there are 25 water bowsers from YCDC and 308 fire engines and fuel bowsers from the Fire Services Department of Yangon Region,

said U Nyi Nyi Min.

Furthermore, it is understood that in the event of a natural disaster, including a storm, the township-level and regional-level units are prepared to respond immediately for rescue operations in Bago and Ayeyawady regions. — ASH/TKO

Kalaw tourism boost to uplift local economy

DEVELOPMENT of Kalaw and its tourism will help the socioeconomy of the local community improve, according to a tourism development forum.

The Destination Management Organization plays a crucial role in effectuating destination development and sustainable tourism. All the stakeholders, including related departments, organizations, and tourism agencies, must exert concerted efforts to achieve this, as quoted Dr Thet Thet Khine, Union Minister for Hotels and Tourism, remarking at an event held on 24 May.

According to the UNWTO

World Tourism Barometer, international tourist arrivals in 2023 rose worldwide by 34 per cent compared to that of 2022. Myanmar also saw a rebound in tourist arrivals.

Additionally, a strategic plan included in a three-year project to promote Kalaw's destination (2022-2025) needs to be implemented. The DMO and locals must work together to bring about socio-economic development through tourism.

Kalaw attracts the second largest number of visitors among the cities in southern Shan State, and some also visit the Inlay Lake, Pindaya and other surrounding areas.

The homegrown travellers from central and lower Myanmar mostly visit the following popular destinations in Kalaw hill station: Pine Forest, Kalaw Myoma Market, Kalaw Railway Station, Mahamuni Hnee Buddha Image, Kalaw Thein Mountain, Kalaw Clock Tower and Ozi Mountain, Kalaw View Point, Kalaw Hill Top Villa Hotel, Kalaw City View, Kalaw Italy Church, Yay Yaungma ViewPoint, Old railway between the valley, Myinmahti natural cave, Byike Mountain, Kalaw ShweUMin cave and elephant camp. — TWA/KK

Deep Depression Condition

According to the observations at (22:30) hrs MST today, the Cyclonic Storm "REMAL" which has crossed to the Southwest of Dhaka (Bangladesh) and has moved North-Northeastwards and weakend into a Deep depression and reach to the Northwest of Dhaka (Bangladesh). It is contiunuously moved to North-Northeastwards and gradually weaken into a Depression during next (6) hours.

General caution

Under the influence of Deep Depression, rain or thundershowers will be fairly widespread to widespread in Nay Pyi Taw, Sagaing, Mandalay, Magway, Bago, Yangon, Ayeyawady Regions and Kachin, Chin, Rakhine States with likelihood of regionally heavyfalls in Chin, Rakhine States and isolated heavyfalls in Sagaing, Mandalay, Magway, Ayeyawady Regions and Kachin State along with strong winds during next (24) hours. Occasional squalls with rough seas will be experienced in Deltic, off and along Rakhine Coasts. Surface wind speed in squall

may reach 40 mph and wave height will be about 9-13 feet.



ON behalf of the Vietnam Business Club in Myanmar (VBCM), the BIDV Yangon branch's CEO Mr Nguyen Quang Ngoc provided financial aid worth K12 million for a basic Vietnamese language course batch at Yangon University of Foreign Languages (YUFL).

- 2. The right to education is a fundamental right for children. Article 26 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights states, "Everyone has the right to education." Additionally, Article 366 (a) of the Constitution of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar (2008) stipulates that "Every citizen, in accord with the educational policy laid down by the Union, has the right to education." A comprehensive education system that ensures access to education for all school-age children is being systematically promoted, beginning with basic education.
- 3. The current period marks the school enrollment week for the 2024-2025 academic year. Every school-age child, inclusive of those with disabilities and those who have lost their right to education for various reasons, should not be left behind. The Myanmar National Human Rights Commission strongly urges parents, legal guardians, family members, and stakeholders to prioritize the best interests of the children and make every effort to ensure their enrollment on time.

CBM Governor meets Thai banks' officials



CBM Governor Daw Than Than Swe holds talks with CEOs and officials of Thai banks yesterday in Yangon.

GOVERNOR Daw Than Than Swe of the Central Bank of Myanmar and officials from Siam Commercial Bank, Bangkok Bank, Kasikorn Bank and Krung Thai Bank met yesterday morning at the meeting hall of the Yangon branch of the Central Bank of Myanmar.

They discussed further investment of Thailand in Myanmar, foreign currency banking services between Myanmar and Thailand, CBM's established policies to stabilize the foreign exchange rate, remittances of trade and Myanmar migrant workers to be diverted from legal channels instead of using illegal Hundis, facilitation of smooth delivery of the wages of expatriate Myan-

mar workers in Thailand to their families, more investments from Thailand in Myanmar, education and health-related matters on Hundai's actions to be cooperated by Thai banks, provision of financial support (pre-shipment export financing and post-shipment export financing) to further develop trade between Thailand and Myanmar, foreign exchange rates and the facilitation of foreign currency transfers between the two countries.

CBM Governor Daw Than Than Swe, deputy governors, directors-general, CEOs and officials of Siam Commercial Bank, Bangkok Bank, Kasikorn Bank, and Krung Thai Bank attended the meeting. — MNA/TS

More unauthorized money changers face legal action for illegal transactions

- 1. THE Central Bank of Myanmar found that transactions of foreign currencies have been taking place using the following Facebook pages and internet websites without holding a foreign currency business licence issued by the Central Bank of Myanmar, and has taken action against those involved in such transactions. In addition, the Facebook pages and phone numbers of those conducting transactions from overseas locations have been reported to the relevant central banks, and negotiations are being carried out to take action against them.

- 2. The Central Bank of Myanmar is working with law enforcement agencies to identify, arrest, and take action against such businesses, and further monitoring and action will be taken. The developments of the operation will be communicated to the public in real time.
- 3. Therefore, we further inform the public about exchanging foreign currencies only at licensed financial institutions to exchange foreign currencies.
- 4. We further inform the public that those who are illegally trading and speculating in foreign currencies on the above-mentioned Facebook pages and internet websites will be prosecuted under Sections 38 and 42 of the Foreign Exchange Management Law, as well as under sections of the Penal Code for harming the public interest.

Myanmar Embassy repatriates one citizen from Saudi Arabia

THE government cares for its citizens residing abroad, assists them if they face hardships, and manages to bring its citizens back home by cooperating with Myanmar embassies and relevant embassies.

The Myanmar Embassy to Saudi Arabia communicated with the authorities of Riyadh to repatriate one Myanmar female citizen, Ma May Phyu Latt, who faced hardships in Riyadh, by flight on 26 May, and she arrived in Yangon yesterday evening.

Ma May Phyu Latt requested her employer to send her back the agent in Dubai for poor relations with her employ-

er in Riyadh. But she was not allowed, and so she ran away. Meanwhile, she met two Pakistanis, and she was employed at another house, where she worked for over two months. She requested her employer to send her back to Dubai, and she had to stay at the airport for 12 days. The official of King Khalid **International Airport reported** to the Myanmar Embassy, and the embassy took her on 10 May. After the negotiation with the relevant Saudi Arabia authority, she obtained her exit permit and arrived back in Yangon yesterday evening.

She said, "I live in Bago. I

have a child, and I went abroad for a well-paid job purpose. When I arrived there, I faced many hardships like food, sleep deprivation, language and salary. I can't work anymore at my new house, and so they sent me to the airport. After ten days at the airport, I thought I would never get back to my country, but the airport staff informed the Myanmar embassy, and the officials took me immediately. At the embassy, the staff comforted me. I thanked the Head of the State and enbassy officials for the warm and helpful support for my return home." — Nyein Thu(MNA)/KTZH

Illegal trade crackdown yields significant seizures in Magway, Bago regions

SUPERVISED by the Illegal Trade Eradication Steering Committee, legal action is being taken against illicit trading across the nation.

During inspections on 21, 22, and 24 May, combined inspection teams under the Magway Region Illegal Trade Eradication Special Task Force seized 300 gallons of crude oil worth K900,000 in the Chauk oil field, an unregistered Luojia 125 motorbike valued at K400,000 in Ngaphe township, 2.535 tonnes of illegal timber worth K1.019 million in Mindon township, 1.161 tonnes of

illegal timber worth K305,021 in Kanma township, an unregistered Taryan Wave 110 motorbike worth K700,000 in Aunglan township, and an unregistered Honda Fit valued at K11 million at the Ayeyawady Bridge (Magway) checkpoint. This enforcement was carried out under the Public Property Protection Law, the Export and Import Law, and the Forest Law.

On 27 May, the on-duty teams under the Bago Region Illegal Trade Eradication Special Task Force captured illegal teak weighing 3.002 tonnes worth K1.395 million in Toungoo district and a TT bus (estimated value of K30 million) heading to Yangon from Thanbyuzayat, carrying five kinds of goods worth K13.28 million, including 3,600 bottles of Deedo orange juice from Thailand without official documents, at the Naungkhashay X-ray station. The action was conducted under the Forest Law and Customs procedures.

The Illegal Trade Eradication Steering Committee reported that nine arrests were made on 21, 22, 24, and 27 May, with an estimated value of K59 million. — MNA/MKKS

Over K4B worth of heroin, stimulant tablets and opium oil extract confiscated in Nawnghkio township

ACCORDING to the Myanmar Police Force, heroin, stimulant tablets, and opium oil extract worth over K4.75 billion were seized in Nawnghkio township.

Acting on a tip-off, a combined team from the Anti-Drug Police Force stopped and searched a Dongfeng truck driven by Sai Phaung, accompanied by Min Paing Htoo, travelling from Yatsawk to Nawnghkio on the Yatsawk-Nawnghkio road at 10 pm on 19 May. The search revealed 123.2 kilogrammes of heroin, 5.65 million stimulant tablets, and 52 kilogrammes of opium oil extract, valued at over K4.75 billion, hidden in chaff bags.

Similarly, the police arrested Myo Min Htun, Kyaw Thet Oo, Aye Kyaw (aka) Kyaw Naing, and Hein Htet Aung, who were involved in the case, along with a Nissan AD van and a Toyota Probox.

Additionally, the police arrested Ko Pyae (aka) Pyae Phyo Thu (aka) Min Myat Naing and Ma Thwel Sam Eain, who were responsible for transporting the drugs from Shan State to Mandalay Region in Mahaaungmyay township at 7:30 pm on 22 May.

They are being prosecuted, and investigations into the perpetrators are ongoing, according to the Myanmar Police Force.

MoE to sell 2M gallons of gasoline to private entrepreneurs

THE Ministry of Energy (MOE) has announced that two million gallons of gasoline from the Thanbayakan petrochemical plants will be available for sale to private entrepreneurs through a tender system in June and July.

The Myanmar Petrochemical Enterprise under the Ministry of Energy will sell one million gallons on 4 June and another million gallons on 2 July, totalling two million gallons of gasoline.

Currently, the Ministry of Energy is exploring various methods to increase oil and natural gas production and to produce and utilise more

value-added products such as Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) and Liquefied Petroleum Gas (LPG). Given the high demand for CNG and LPG as alternatives to diesel and gasoline, efforts are being made to meet this demand.—TWA/TKO

Magway Region sees brisk sales of cottonseed from gins

COTTONSEED, which is an industrial crop, is in high demand from the mills, according to the Magway Region Government Office.

Most townships in the region cultivate cotton, which is 172,793 acres. Gangaw Township possesses only a handful of cotton acres.

Products obtained from grinding cottonseed are exported. The businesses of fried crispy bean fritters mostly buy mill-processing cotton seed oil.

Next, the Cotton Producers Association organized a coordination meeting on cotton supply chain development in early May.

The meeting outcomes highlighted a loan plan jointly provided by the Ministry of Commerce, the Agriculture Department, the Ministry of Cooperatives and Rural Development, quality seed, agriculture methods and exemption of mandatory dollar conversion into local currency specified by the Central Bank of Myanmar upon exportation through Kawthoung-Ranong trade channel.

The Ministry of Industry will purchase three million visses of cotton in the current 2024-2025 financial year, including 2.9 million visses of A-grade cotton and 100,000 visses of C-grade cotton. - NN/KK

YGN palm oil wholesale reference rate sees small rebound this week ending 2 June

THE wholesale reference rate of palm oil for the Yangon market was set higher a bit to K5,270 per viss this week ending 2 June from K5,200 recorded last week ending 26 May, according to the Supervisory Committee on edible oil import and distribution.

The Supervisory Committee on Edible Oil Import and Distribution under the Ministry of Commerce has been closely observing the FOB prices in Malaysia and Indonesia, adding transport costs, tariffs and banking services to decide the wholesale market reference rate for edible oil on a weekly basis.

Yet, the market price is higher than the reference price.

To control overcharging, the Consumer Affairs Department under the Ministry of Commerce informed the consumers of lodging the complaints for overcharging through the call centre's hotline in late August. The department urged consumers not to buy palm oil at high prices. The Committee notified that

any person who is involved in price gouging and oil storage to attempt market manipulation will face legal action under the **Essential Goods and Services**

The department is working together with the Myanmar Oil Dealers' Association and the cooking oil importing companies to offer affordable rates of imported palm oil for con-

Complaints for overcharging can be lodged over hotline 1535 of the call centre of the Consumers Affairs Department or sent to the Facebook Page of the Department and the region and state departments concerned.

The domestic consumption of palm oil is estimated at one million tonnes per year. The local palm oil production is just about 400,000 tonnes. About 700,000 tonnes of palm oil are yearly imported through Malaysia and Indonesia to meet

than boys. Many of these incidents occur via mobile phones. A World Health Organization (WHO) report from March highlighted that school-age children suffered severe cyberbullying impacts even before outbreaks of the COVID-19 The report further details

that oral bullying accounts for 79 per cent of all cases, making it the most common form, followed by social bullying at 50 per cent, physical bullying at 29 per cent, and cyberbullying at 25 per cent. In schools, bullying often occurs among students, although it can also involve school staff. Surveys reveal that physical punishment is still practised in schools across 67 countries.

Bullying in schools can severely affect victims' learning, mental health, and overall

development. Educational reports indicate that bullied children are often demotivated to attend school, leading to poorer academic performance compared to their peers. This academic decline can result in a higher dropout rate, as these students are more likely to leave school after completing high school. Preventing bullying is crucial for the safety and well-being of society. Implementing anti-bullying policies, promoting awareness, and fostering a supportive environment are essential steps. Schools and workplaces must create safe spaces where individuals feel respected and valued, regardless of their background or characteristics. By addressing bullying comprehensively, everybody can protect vulnerable individuals and build a more inclusive and harmonious society.

Although action can be taken against acts of bullying in society and workplaces in accordance with relevant laws, rules, and regulations, handling bullying in schools among students is very subtle. However, teachers, parents, students and departmental officials have to make a quadruple effort to prevent bullying in schools and protect students and young people against bullying in all forms in order to enhance the morale of the people.

S I have seen the news about brutal and inhumane terrorist murders of NUG and PDF groups, which are circulating on social media platforms these days, I wrote this open letter as a responsible citizen to inform those who are backing terrorists. Their crimes are frequently seen and heard, with evidence in their statements and on social media reports.

If we view the current conflicts in Myanmar rationally, people can clearly witness that NUG and PDFs practise violent killings of people and extremism under the pretext of political gain. Some countries are informally engaging with NUG. Actually, they want to pressure Myanmar to topple the SAC government in Myanmar and try to support it in various forms, NUG and PDFs. Thus, they have ignored terrorists' attacks on non-military targets (i.e. civilian targets) and violent killings of civilians. Such kind of actions should not be done.

On 9 May 2024, PDF terrorists willfully launched shell attacks as well as fired small arms at Hsonywa village in Myingyan Township, Mandalay Region, under the pretext of opposition to them and a different mindset from theirs. Terrorists' shells landed on the residential houses in the village where only innocent civilians live, killing a total of 32 locals, 17 men and 15 other women, and injuring

THE World Health Organization (WHO) and STOP, a global tobacco industry watchdog, are launching on 23 May "Hooking the next generation", a report highlighting how the tobacco and nicotine industry designs products, implements marketing campaigns and works to shape policy environments to help them addict the world's

cent of 15-year-olds surveyed reported using e-cigarettes in

the past 30 days.

Despite significant progress in reducing tobacco use, the emergence of e-cigarettes and other new tobacco and nicotine products present a grave threat to youth and tobacco control. Studies demonstrate that e-cigarette use increases conventional cigarette use, particularly among non-smok-

Research in the United States of America found that more than 70 per cent of youth e-cigarette users would quit if the products were only available in tobacco flavour.

"These industries are intentionally designing products and utilizing marketing strategies that appeal directly to children," said Dr Ruediger Krech, Director, WHO Director of Health Promotion. "The use of child-friendly flavours like

cotton candy and bubblegum. toys, is a blatant attempt to addict young people to these harmful products."

These deceptive tactics highlight the urgent need for strong regulations to protect young people from a lifetime of harmful dependence.

WHO urges governments to protect young people from the uptake of tobacco, e-cigarettes and other nicotine products by banning or tightly regulating these products.

Contact Bagan's Archaeological Department before buying land

IN order to avoid financial losses when purchasing land plots in the Bagan Cultural Heritage Zone, the Department of Archaeology and National Museum (Bagan Branch) can be contacted prior to any purchase, according to the department.

A total of 56,689.21 acres with 12,342.29 acres of the property area and 44,346.29 acres of the buffer area includes two cities — NyaungU and Bagan — and 41 villages, it announced.

The department preserves the cultural heritage of 3,595 pagodas in the property area and 242 in the buffer area, a total of 3,837 ancient buildings for the sake of quality, value and integrity of each race in a country, which will enable

the love and honour with national spirit.

To maintain the landscape and farming along the ancient buildings, which are also a lovable heritage, the 5th meeting of the Bagan National Coordinating Committee (BAGANCOM) held at the department on 8 October 2020 resolved to restrict the granting of industrial and commercial land leases and other uses of farms inside the Bagan Cultural Heritage Zone and to allow them only outside the zone.

Since land-use permits cannot be granted for vacant farmlands outside the urban areas within the Bagan Cultural Heritage Zone, those who

want to buy these plots for various purposes, s u c h

as creating residential areas, shops or religious buildings, may face financial losses, the department warned.

The Integrated Management Framework (5.2) of Bagan also describes the need to fully protect the urban areas, restrict development activities, disallow any construction work in areas where there are no buildings yet, and follow the rules for landscaping in the cultural zone.

People are therefore advised to contact the Department of Archaeology and National Museum (Bagan Branch), which is responsible for the preservation of the cultural heritage, before buying land in Bagan to avoid financial losses.



ME in Tokyo lists required documents, payments for passport renewals

THE Myanmar Embassy to Japan has announced the lists of people who still need to send the required documents for passport renewal and those who have renewed their passports but need to pay the booklet fees and income tax.

The embassy provides consular services for the interests of Myanmar nationals in Japan in accordance with the laws, rules, regulations, and procedures. The required documents and application procedures for the respective passport types are published on its website:

High domestic demand for eels boosts farming potential

DOMESTIC eel consumption has been high, and the market will expand if its farming develops, said eel farmers.

"In the Yangon market, eel price varies on a daily basis. Domestic eel consumption is high. We export it to other regions and states. Some don't have knowledge about the eel farming market, and they don't know the farming technique. Eel breeding hasn't yet been developed in the country. Some eat eels caught naturally. At present, eel breeding is operated in Thanlyin and Kayan townships. There is a plan to farm eel this year. The market has potential because eel consumption is high if eel farming expands in this monsoon season," said Ko San Lin Kyi, an eel farmer from Thanlyin Township's Kalawe village.

The market has been positive, plus there is a sentiment that eating eel is good for health, which is why he urged to farm eel in this monsoon.

"I want eel farming to be developed because the market has been positive. From the aspect of health, it helps increase red blood cells and helps keep bones healthy. The sale is good every year," said Ko San Lin Kyi.

Eel has many advantages, such as rapid growth, high reproduction, the ability to survive on little food, and resistance to contaminated water. From a two-month-old, it reproduces by laying eggs once every two months. It is weather-resistant and hard to die. Therefore, eel farming is cost-effective and more manageable than other fish and prawn farming if it is bred by making some modifications corresponding to its nature. — Thit Taw/ZS

Turkish ceramist offers artistic solace to patients

Kavukcu believes working with clay can be a healing experience, providing solace and emotional support.

PEOPLE suffering from various health issues are finding therapeutic solace offered by a female Turkish ceramist willing to go the extra mile for those in need of inner well-being and emotional support.

In a small studio in the distant Batikent district of Türkiye's capital city Ankara, a cheerful group of mostly female participants engage in small talk as they work on different ceramic objects.

"Working with clay can be a therapeutic experience for many people, particularly those bothered by health issues," said ceramic artist Duygu Kavukcu.

Kavukcu is now offering sessions that appeal to the souls

of people with a range of conditions, including cancer and anxiety.

"We want people who participate in our courses to socialize, to find themselves, and forget their daily grievances through clay," she told Xinhua.

For several years, this ceramist, who left a ten-year-long career as an air traffic controller to pursue her dreams, has been dispensing regular classes for people affected by ailments of various seriousness.

"It's not only cancer patients, but we also have participants suffering from epilepsy or muscular diseases, and they all say that they find themselves in clay," she said. —Xinhua

EAST China's Jiangsu Province has announced a comprehensive plan to improve traditional Chinese medicine (TCM) services, leveraging the unique strengths of TCM to elevate the overall quality of medical services.

As part of its strategy, Jiangsu will boost the capacity of TCM-focused institutions to handle outpatient and emergency services. The plan includes the establishment of multidisciplinary diagnosis and treatment teams, aiming to strengthen the integration of TCM approaches within the healthcare system.

Dust storm affects 3rd stage of Taklimakan Rally

China becoming important player in intl cruise industry

SINCE its maiden voyage at the beginning of year, China's first domestically built large cruise ship Adora Magic City has completed 34 journeys and received nearly 150,000 tourists so far.

In the meantime, China's second homegrown large cruise ship entered a shipyard in Shanghai for final assembly on 20 April, signifying that China has developed the capability to engage in bulk production of cruise ships.

The cruise industry, with a long industrial chain and high degree of internationalization, is often called "the golden industry that floats." Over 1,000 domestic and foreign manufacturers were involved in the building of Adora Magic City.

The cruise ship is 323.6 metres in length, has a gross

weight of 135,500 tonnes, and can accommodate up to 5,246 passengers across a total of 2,125 guest rooms. The number of parts is equivalent to five times that of the C919 large aircraft and 13 times that of the Fuxing high-speed train.

China has since become the fifth country in the world with the ability to design and build large cruise ships. The commercial success of Adora Magic City also demonstrates that China is capable of complete and independent operation of large cruise ships, according to Liu Hui, general manager of CSSC Cruise Technology Development Co, Ltd.

In comparison to Adora Magic City, the new ship boasts a larger size, with a tonnage of over 140,000 tonnes, a length of

341 meters, a width of 37.2 metres, and features 2,144 cabins. Two sets of desulfurization systems and five sets of selective catalytic reduction equipment will be added, making the entire ship more environmentally friendly.

Also compared with Adora Magic City, the area of public spaces, and for outdoor activities and leisure has increased by 735 square metres and 1,913 square metres, respectively, to 25,599 square metres and 14,272 square metres, further improv-

ing the comfort and experience of passengers.

Although the ship is larger, the construction speed has been accelerated thanks to a series of scientific research achievements, management experience and methods. — Xinhua

Vietnam earns US\$725 mln from exporting tra fish in 5 months

VIETNAM earned an estimated US\$725 million from shipping tra fish overseas during the first five months of 2024, up two per cent year-on-year, Vietnam News Agency reported Monday, citing the General Department of Vietnam Customs. The country's tra fish export has roared back to growth after a significant drop recorded earlier this year as countries have scaled up their imports, the agency cited insiders.

The United States remained the largest buyer, followed by China, Europe, and several South American markets, according to the Vietnam Association of Seafood Exporters and Producers. —Xinhua

Singapore records 10.5% service industry growth in Q1

SINGAPORE'S business receipts index for the service industries increased 10.5 per cent year-on-year in the first quarter this year, the Department of Statistics said Monday. The revenue of recreation and personal services grew 25.9 per cent year-on-year in the first three months, supported by higher earnings of firms in the gaming and attractions segments.

The information and communications industry reported a year-on-year increase of 24.9 per cent in revenue. Meanwhile, the administrative and support services saw a marginal decline of 0.1 per cent, with rental and leasing activities recording lower turnover. — Xinhua

China-Japan-South Korea business summit pledges efforts to promote cooperation

MORE than 200 participants of the 8th China-Japan-South Korea Business Summit here on Monday hailed the resumption of trilateral economic and trade cooperation with fresh impetus injected after a hiatus of more than four years, pledging efforts to promote the cooperation between business communities.

The business figures from China, Japan and South Korea gathered on the sidelines of the 9th trilateral leaders' meeting held here on Sunday and Monday after a halt due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The last leaders' meeting was held in December 2019 in China's southwestern city of Chengdu.

Business communities in the three neighbouring countries hailed the convening of the trilateral leaders' meeting and its outcomes, voiced support for trilateral economic cooperation, and pledged efforts towards closer cooperation in facilitating digital transition, stimulating trade, stabilizing supply chains, green transition, responses to population ageing, and healthcare, among other areas. Guest speakers from China, Japan and South Korea at the summit shared their insight into economic revitalization and sustainable development amid the changes in regional and international situations, highlighting population ageing as a common socioeconomic challenge for the three nations demanding cooperation of the business communities in a proactive response.

As the three countries are all manufacturing powerhouses, some speakers called for collaboration in seeking solutions to the many common problems related to reducing carbon emissions, expecting cooperation in various fields including developing low-carbon technology to yield greater result.

Noting growing uncertainties in the global economic environment, a joint statement signed at the summit announced the establishment of a working group for a joint trilateral response and preemptive coordination on trade issues, in hopes that the business summit and the working group will serve as both catalyst and platform for cooperation.

The business summit is jointly sponsored by Korea Chamber of Commerce and Industry (KCCI), China Council for the Promotion of International Trade (CCPIT) and Japan Business Federation, better known as Keidanren. — Xinhua

European, Asian stocks rise as traders eye US inflation

ASIAN and European stock markets rose Monday in holiday-thinned trading, with investors awaiting fresh US and European inflation data for more clarity on the outlook for interest rates.

Sentiment took a blow last week after Federal Reserve officials warned they wanted more evidence that prices were being brought under control, fuelling worries they might not cut interest rates this year.

That was compounded by figures suggesting the world's number one economy remained strong, despite borrowing costs being kept at two-decade highs.

broad-based S&P 500 index and the tech-heavy Nasdag both benefited Friday from figures showing one-year expectations for prices edged down slightly, while consumer sentiment picked up.

The positivity followed through to Asia on Monday, which was also boosted by news that profits at China's industrial companies rose in April, having dropped the month before.

Hong Kong, Tokyo, Shanghai, Sydney, Seoul, Mumbai, Singapore, Bangkok and Taipei all rose, though there were some losses in Jakarta, Manila and Wellington.

Paris, Frankfurt and But Wall Street's Milan advanced at midday

despite a survey showing German business sentiment stagnated in May after months of improvement, denting hopes that Europe's biggest economy is on course for a strong recovery.

London was closed for a holiday. Wall Street is also closed on Monday.

"Markets continue to consolidate while global investors remain discerning on signs of US economic health and Fed's plausible monetary path," said Edward Ng, of Nikko Asset Management.

Focus is now turning to the release of the US personal consumption expenditures (PCE) index, which is the Fed's pre-

ferred gauge of inflation.

"Investors will look to US PCE print this Friday as a potential signpost for further market directions," Ng added.

The reading comes after the consumer price index edged down in April, having come in above forecasts for each of the previous three months. — AFP

Cambodia calls on entrepreneurs to use e-commerce platform to meet global market

CAMBODIA on Monday called on entrepreneurs to use e-commerce platform like China's Alibaba to sell their products to the international market.

Speaking at a seminar on "Beyond borders: bringing Cambodian products to the global market through Alibaba.com," Cambodian Minister of Commerce Cham Nimul said his ministry and the Alibaba Group inked a Memorandum of Understanding to directly sell Cambodian products on the Alibaba e-commerce platform in October 2023.

"To date, about 10 Cambodian enterprises have put up their products such as peppercorns, mango jam and bird nest for sale on the e-commerce platform," she told some 320 participants. "I'd like to encourage small and medium-sized enterprises to market their products on the platform in order to help boost the exports of Cambodian products to China and the global market," she added. Nimul said Cambodia will launch a national pavilion on the Alibaba.com in September on the sidelines of the 21st China-ASEAN (Association of Southeast Asian Nations) Expo. The minister highlighted that under the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) Agreement and the Cambodia-China Free Trade Agreement, Cambodia is able to export its products to the fellow RCEP members and China with preferential tariffs.

Cambodia exported products worth US\$8 billion in the first four months of 2024, up 15.2 per cent from 6.94 billion dollars over the same period last year, according to the General Department of Customs and Excise's report. - Xinhua

China, S Korea building up momentum to grow ties, bolster cooperation

IN fresh exchanges between their leaders, China and South Korea reaffirmed their commitment to enhancing mutual trust and expanding cooperation, a solid move to stabilize bilateral relations and ensure good neighbourliness after years of twists and turns in bilateral ties.

Chinese Premier Li Qiang on Sunday held separate meetings with South Korean President Yoon Suk-yeol and Samsung Electronics Chairman Lee Jae-yong in Seoul prior to Monday's ninth Trilateral Summit Meeting among China, Japan and South Korea.

The widely-anticipated meeting is believed to be an effective gathering to strengthen trilateral cooperation after the mechanism witnessed a hiatus of about four and a half years.

China and South Korea have made substantial progress in growing their relations

over the past more than three decades, but shifts in South Korea's foreign policy and geopolitical tensions, among other factors, have brought their relationship into headwinds.

"The bilateral meeting between leaders of the two countries on the occasion of the trilateral meeting will help push China-South Korea relations back on track of stable development," said Dong Xiangrong, senior fellow at the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences.

During Li's meetings with Yoon and Lee, both sides depicted economic and trade cooperation as the "ballast of China-South Korea relations".

Describing the industrial and supply chains of China and South Korea as deeply intertwined, Li warned against turning economic and trade issues into political or security issues.

Maintaining stable and smooth industrial and supply chains of the two countries serves their own interests. In the semiconductor sector, for instance, despite pressures from the United States, China's industrial chain continues to benefit South Korean companies including Samsung. — Xinhua

PNG authorities confirm over 2,000 buried alive in landslide

THE Papua New Guinea (PNG) National Disaster Centre (NDC) has confirmed that more than 2,000 people were buried alive after a massive landslide disaster occurred on Friday in Enga Province.

Chief of Mission for the International Organization for Migration (IOM) in the Pacific island country Serhan Aktoprak told Xinhua that the United Nations (UN) migration agency received the statement on Monday.

According to the statement issued by the centre's acting director Lusete Laso Mana, the disaster also caused major destruction to buildings and food gardens, as well as led to a major impact on the economic lifeline of PNG. — Xinhua

15 people killed as storms hit southern US states

AT least 15 people have died in the southern US states of Texas, Arkansas, Oklahoma, and Kentucky after powerful storms and tornados hit the region.

In Texas, the storm destroyed a roadside travel stop and a community of mobile homes in Cooke County. Texas Governor Greg Abbot said at a press briefing on Sunday that seven people were killed and more than 100 others injured.

Over 200 homes and other buildings were destroyed, and another 120 structures were damaged, he added. – Xinhua

Gaza officials say 40 killed as Israeli strikes set tents ablaze

GAZA'S civil defence agency said Monday that the death toll had risen to 40 from overnight Israeli strikes that set ablaze tents of displaced Palestinians in Rafah, an attack that sparked condemnation across the Arab

Israel's army said the air strikes late Sunday, hours after a rocket attack had targeted Tel Aviv, had killed two senior Hamas operatives, and that it was investigating the reports of civilians killed in a fire.

The Israeli attack sparked strong protests from Egypt, Jordan, Kuwait and from Qatar which warned it could "hinder" budding steps to revive stalled truce and hostage release talks in the Israel-Hamas war raging since 7 October.

Gaza's civil defence agency said Monday that many bodies were "charred" after the strikes triggered a fire that ripped through a displacement centre in northwest Rafah.

"The massacre committed by the Israeli occupation army in the refugee tents northwest of Rafah city in the southern Gaza Strip has left 40 martyrs and 65 wounded," said agency official Mohammad al-Mughayyir.

"We saw charred bodies and dismembered limbs ... We

also saw cases of amputations, wounded children, women and the elderly."

Footage released by the Palestinian Red Crescent Society showed chaotic night-time scenes of paramedics in ambulances racing to the fiery attack site and evacuating the wounded, including children. — AFP

Myanmar to play against Indonesia in ASEAN Mitsubishi Electric Cup 2024 opener

MYANMAR will play against Indonesia at the opener of the ASEAN Mitsubishi Electric Cup 2024, as the ASEAN Football Federation has released the fixtures for group matches of the tournament.

The final stage of the cup will comprise two groups of five teams each. Group A consists of defending champions Thailand, Malaysia, Singapore, Cambodia and the qualified team from the play-off match. Group B comprises Vietnam, Indonesia, the Philippines, Myanmar and Laos.

According to the fixtures, Myanmar has to play with Indonesia and Laos at home and the Philippines and Vietnam at away.

The matches of Cambodia versus Malaysia and the qualified team from the play-off match versus Thailand will be held on 23 November. Likewise, matches of Myanmar versus Indonesia and Laos versus Vietnam will take place on 24 November.

On 26 November, Malaysia will meet with the qualified team from the play-off match, whereas Singapore will face Cambodia. Indonesia will take on Laos, while Myanmar will fight against the Philippines on 27 November.

On 29 November, the qualified team from the play-off match

will compete with Singapore as well, and Thailand will play with Malaysia. Furthermore, a match between Laos and the Philippines and one more match between Vietnam and Indonesia will be held on 30 November.

Similarly, Singapore has to meet with Thailand, whereas Cambodia will take on the qualified team from the play-off match on 2 December.

On 3 December, the Philippines will encounter Vietnam and Myanmar will play with Laos. On 6 December, Thailand will face Cambodia, while Malaysia will meet with Singapore. The last matches, Vietnam versus Myanmar and Indonesia

versus the Philippines, will take place on 7 December.

Semifinals and finals will be held in the home and away system. The first leg of the semifinals will take place on 10 and 11 December, and the second leg on 13 and 14 December. The finals will be held on 17 and 21 December. — Ko Nyi Lay/TTA

Southampton beat Leeds in play-off final to return to Premier League

SOUTHAMPTON returned to the Premier League just a year after suffering relegation from the top flight with a 1-0 win over Leeds United in the Championship (second division) play-off final on Sunday.

Adam Armstrong's 24th-minute goal was enough to send the "Saints" back to the elite over Leeds, who also suffered relegation a year ago.

Southampton join Leicester City and Ipswich Town in returning to the Premier League after they finished first and second in the regular season,



with 90 points to Southampton's 87, but Southampton fans will point to the fact that they won both of their league ties against Leeds, beating them 3-1 at home and winning 2-1 in Leeds' Elland Road ground on the last day of the regular campaign.

The task that now awaits Leicester, Ipswich and Southampton is establishing themselves back in the Premier League. This has become increasingly difficult in recent campaigns and the fact that the three promoted teams last season (Burnley, Sheffield United and Luton Town) have all gone straight.

Para athletics icon Yamamoto aims to develop world-class talent

JAPANESE para athletics icon Atsushi Yamamoto said Monday he wants to develop world-class athletes after calling time on his 22-year competitive career.

Yamamoto, who has a prosthetic leg, earned a pair of silver medals in the long jump while making four Summer Paralympic appearances between 2008 and 2021. He also became a Winter Olympian in 2018 when he snowboarded in Pyeongchang, South Korea.

"I've wanted to show people how much I can do with this leg," the 42-year-old said during his retirement press conference in Kobe while sharing plans to coach young athletes.

"I want to develop athletes who can compete on the world stage."

Yamamoto lost his left leg in a traffic accident when he was in high school. He decided to call it a career after finishing fifth in the long jump at the World Para Athletics Championships that ended last week-

The fifth is to strive to promote sustainable development, strengthen exchanges and cooperation in the fields of low-carbon transformation, climate change, aging population, and epidemic response, among others, and explore and carry out more "China-Japan-South Korea + X" cooperation projects.

Li pointed out that the current situation on the Korean Peninsula remains tense. All parties should play a constructive role by staying committed to easing tensions, restarting dialogue as soon as possible, and advancing the political settlement process of the Korean Peninsula issue, so as to safeguard peace and stability in the region. —Xinhua

N Korea informs Japan it will launch satellite before

ORTH Korea has notified Japan of a plan to launch a satellite-carrying rocket before 4 June, the Japanese government announced Monday, putting the region on high alert over the possible use of ballistic missile tech-

The notice, which came ahead of a trilateral summit between Japan, China and South Korea in Seoul on Monday, designated three maritime danger zones believed to be the areas where rocket debris may fall — two west of the Korean Peninsula and the other to the east of the Philippines' island of Luzon, the Japan Coast Guard said.

In reaction to the notification, officials from Japan, the United States and South Korea confirmed during phone talks that they will urge North Korea to cancel the plan as any launch of a projectile using ballistic missile technology constitutes a violation of UN resolutions, according to the Japanese Foreign Ministry.

Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida, who is currently in South Korea for the summit involving the East Asian leaders, told relevant ministries and agencies early Monday to make maximum efforts to gather and analyze information about the possible satellite launch.

On Sunday, Kishida and his South Korean counterpart President Yoon Suk Yeol agreed to work together in addressing Pyongthreats during bilateral talks in the South Korean capital. An official of the South Korean mili-North Korea said the sattary's Joint ellite was successfully Chiefs of Staff said Friday the country had detected activity indicating North

Korea was likely preparing to launch a reconnaissance satellite. Signs of preparations for a military spy satellite launch were seen in the Tongchang-ri area in North Korea's northwest, the official told reporters. Pyongyang last launched a reconnaissance satellite in November and has since unveiled a plan to launch three more this year.
